

The chief focus of the Progress Association at the moment is the Talent Quest, to be held over the weekend 22/24th March. Our Parks & Garden team, minus Andrew, did a great job getting the grounds into order for those people wishing to camp. We are looking forward to a successful event again this year.

We recently received advice, through Bungonia Progress Association, that the operators of Ardmore Park Quarry will be submitting a modification to their Development Approval seeking use of the Oallen Ford Road and Windellama Road to transport 20,000 tonnes of sand to Bannister. This equates to approximately 1,300 truck movements along roads, which in the main, are suitable only for light traffic. There are also two school bus routes along these roads. It would seem they are not proposing any upgrade to either of these roads.

A copy of the relevant proposal can be obtained by calling me on 4844 5157. **Nothing has been lodged at this stage** however we will all be affected if this application is granted. The Progress Association will be sending a submission to Council with regard to this matter and any input from members of the community can be included in our letter.

Our next meeting will be held at Windellama Hall at 2 PM on Monday 15th April. All members of the community are welcome.

Weeds Planning Workshop

Goulburn Mulwaree Council has piloted a very successful Integrated Weed Management Planning workshop within the Goulburn area. We are now keen to take this initiative out into our regional communities.

If you

- want to take a fresh look at your property;
- wonder why weeds are growing on your property;
- want to aim for a weed resilient property; and
- need help to learn how to develop a weed management plan

then this workshop is for you! Council is offering this one day workshop to the community to effectively manage noxious weeds, for the long term, on their property.

In the morning you will learn:

- what key questions to ask when assessing your property;
- broad mapping, monitoring and land capability assessment techniques;
- the importance of setting plan objectives; and
- how to put all this down into a workable integrated weed management plan.

The afternoon will be spent applying what you have learned by starting to develop your own integrated weed management plan for your property.

Tarago Show 2013

Despite predictions of gloom and doom regarding the weather the 55th Annual Tarago Show went ahead to the delight of participants and attendees.

The Pavilion groaned under the number of entries in all sections and the wonderful standard of those entries made it very hard for the judges to make final decisions. The ladies of the Tarago CWA once again excelled in organising the Pavilion and displaying the best the district has to offer.

The children were well looked after in Kiddies Corner organised by the Tarago Pre School. The Lieder Theatre Youth Group also kept the children entertained doing face painting, stilt walking, roller stilts and juggling. Shayne Richards, the magician, kept young and old in peals of laughter. The kid's races and kid's tug of war were very popular and the pedal cars on loan from Andy Divall were a great hit with the big kids lined up to join in the fun.

The Canberra Bush Dancers Display Group and their musicians enthralled the crowd with their magical, full costume, display of how things used to be. Their old time music and dancing set a great atmosphere for the crowd.

The ANSA NSW Fine Wool State Shearing Championships were very well supported and I am sure the Somerton Merinos were glad to be relieved of their fleeces. The 2013 NSW Fine Wool Shearing Championship was won by Kidman Dunn from Young by 3 points from Mark Dawson of Crookwell.

The entrants for both the horse and dog competitions exceeded all expectations with 660 entries in the horse events and 378 entries in the Dog Show.

The Pubs V RFS tug of war was enjoyed by all, including the participants, and resulted in a number of local organizations, including the Tarago Pre School enjoying the donations of prize money. The Loaded Dog team won the first prize of \$900 and defending champions, Taylor's Creek Fire Brigade, took out second place.

Due largely to the terrific team of volunteers, a very active committee, great sponsors and despite the slow start, the Show was a huge success on the day. The crowd was a little down on the 2011 Show due largely to the changing weather conditions but it remained fine on the day. We have had terrific feedback from attendees, some even considering it our best Show in recent years. After a bit of a break, we will be doing it all again next year on Sunday 2 March 2014 weather permitting.



The following is an excerpt from Max Laidley's book on the 'Tickner' Family History' and the daughter Charlotte who was born at Camden after her parents emigrated from England is the lady who married John James Croker of 'Pleasant Hill' and is also my Great, Great Grandmother.

Chapter 4 PETER TICKNER & MARY ANN CARPENTER

Peter Tickner was the first surviving son of Edward and Sarah; he arrived with his parents and his wife, Mary Ann, aboard the "Florist" when he was about twenty-one years old; he became a farmer at Camden and lived there for the rest of his fairly short life.

Peter was an elder brother of our great-grandfather Henry Tickner and an uncle of our grandmother Sarah Maria Hockey, nee Tickner. Also Peter and Mary Ann were ancestors of our uncle Selby Croker and of our aunt Maude Hockey, nee Croker, and sister of Selby. Peter and Mary Ann also were ancestors of our sister-in-law Gwen Laidley, nee Cooper.

Life of Peter & Mary Ann

Peter Tickner was baptized at East Guldeford on 12 November 1815 and he was married there on 7 December 1836. His wife was Mary Ann Carpenter, a daughter of Robert and Sarah Carpenter of Leeds, Kent. She was born on 5 January 1818.

Peter and Mary Ann had their first two children, Edward and Robert, before they emigrated in 1839 and two more, Charlotte and Richard, were born at Camden.

The shipping record shows Peter as a shepherd and Mary Ann as a farm servant. Both were in good health and both could read and write. Edward was three years old and Robert was twelve months old. Peter was engaged by *Mr Mc Arthur* of Cowpastures. His wages, term and rations were shown (on the shipping record) as unknown.

Peter's occupation changed from a labourer in 1841 to a farmer in 1843 when the Tickners left the service of the Macarthurs.

The year 1841 brought good news and bad news for Peter and Mary Ann. The good news was the birth of their only daughter, Charlotte, and the bad news was the death of their son Robert three months later. Their fourth and last child, Richard, was born in 1843.

Peter Tickner leased two farms from the Macarthurs. They were "Westford" (43 acres of arable land) and "Eastford" (sixty acres of arable land) at Camden. The locations of Peter's two farms, have not been discovered but it is suspected that they were north of "Camberfield" and Cawdor. On each of the few times his address has been discovered in the records it is given as Camden while records for his father and brothers show Razorback or Cawdor as their address.

Peter Tickner died at the age of thirty-eight years, on 23 September 1854 and he was buried at Camden.

Nine days before he died, Peter made a will (something very unusual for residents of Camden at that time). It was a very detailed will, with provisions for his wife and three children, covering the possibilities that his wife might continue farming his leased lands, or that she might surrender the leases, or that she might remarry. The instructions how the stock etc was to be divided when the leases were terminated were very complex and finely graded. Charlotte, his only daughter, was to receive ten pounds per year until she married or the leases were terminated. This was the only will found for any of the Tickners.

Children of Peter & Mary Ann Tickner

So much has been discovered about the children of Peter and Mary Ann and their many connections with other families in the Bungonia and Windellama districts that they are the subjects of Chapter 5. They are mentioned only briefly here.

Edward was the first child and he was born on 10 January 1837, in Sussex, probably at East Guldeford. He spent his early life at Camden, before moving to Albury with his widowed mother, and to the Bungonia district later. He married Susan Fuller at Christ Church, Bungonia, in 1861 and they had eight children.

Robert, the second child of Peter and Mary Ann, was born about 1838 and he died in 1841. Charlotte, the third child, was born on 17 May 1841 and was baptized at Camden on 27 June 1841. She married John James Croker at Jacqua, Bungonia, in 1863 and they had two children.

Richard was the fourth and last child of Peter and Mary Ann. He was born at Camden on 8 May 1843 and was baptized on 2 July 1843. He married Annie Emily Nettleton at Christ Church, Bungonia, in 1867 and they had eleven children.

Later Years of Mary Ann Tickner.

When Peter Tickner died in 1854 his wife, Mary Ann, was still quite young at age thirty-six and, for reasons not discovered, she left Camden on 15 March 1855 to travel to Albury with her three children, a journey that took five weeks and three days. There she bought a forty-seven acre farm, ran out of money, was assisted by Mr George Butt and his family, married William Butt, on 26 April 1856, and moved to Bungonia where her sons Edward and Richard, and daughter Charlotte, and William Butt, in partnership, bought another farm. The source of this information (and more) comes from a letter written by Mary Ann to the executors of the will of Peter Tickner. It is quite amazing that such a letter has survived and has been preserved on microfilm. The letter is reproduced on page below.

From other correspondence it is apparent that Mary Ann terminated the leases of the land that Peter had farmed and sold the stock etc. The executors of the will then held the money in trust for Mary Ann and the children.

The Mr George Butt who helped Mary Ann at Albury was the father of the William Butt she married.

George Butt, with his wife Charlotte and six children, including William who was then only nine years old, were imported by the Macarthurs. They arrived aboard the "Brothers" which reached Sydney on 8 April 1837. They came from Winterborne Strickland, Dorset.

The "Brothers" was the first ship chartered by the Macarthur brothers to import free men, and their families, to work their estates at Camden.

It is likely that William Butt was known to the Tickners before Peter died. It usually was a practical necessity for widows with young children to remarry in those days. She had no children by William Butt.

Mary Ann died on 16 September 1897 and William Butt died on 6 July 1910. Both were buried at Bungonia. They were known to some of the Tickners as grandmother and grandfather Butt.

A Letter by Mary Ann Tickner Albury, April 25th 1855

Sir,

I write to inform you that we have arrived in Albury safe and well after a long journey of five weeks and three days.

Sirs' I received your kind letters in Berrima and I thank you for your kindness. There is no Commissioner staying in Albury at present so the Magistrate has to sell the land when there is any to be sold. Almost all the land handy to the township of Albury has already been sold.

Mr James has bought a farm a few miles out of Albury but that would not suit me. He gave five pounds an acre for it. He gave more than I could give. A gentleman in Albury bought two farms adjoining to Mr Butt a few days before we got to Albury and Mr Butt letting him know I was trying to buy a piece of land as near the town as I could"*, the gentleman came to Mr Butt to see me. He said I could have the farm at the same price he gave for it. That is one pound nine shillings per acre. There is forty-seven acres in the farm and that will be as much as we will be able to manage. Mr Butt knows the land very well and he says it will suit us very well

Everything is very dear in Albury. Flour is eight pounds, tea is ten pounds a chest, and sugar is four to five pounds a hundred. I have found very kind friends in Albury thank God.

I am staying in Mr Butt's yard till I can get a little money up to put up a bark place. Mr Butt has paid for the forty-seven acres of land until I can get it sent up. I was short of money before I got to Albury and now am quite penniless. Mr Butt is keeping me and the children until I can get a little sent up.

Sir I have bought the land in Edward's name as he will be the manager of it .

Sir Please to oblige me by sending me the sum off 130 pounds. It is as little as I can do with or I shall not get any wheat in this year. Edward and Mr Butt's lads are clearing a piece of land to put in a little wheat if we can but I cannot carry on business without money.

Sir please to send it as soon as you can as we are in want.

Sir I remain your obedient servant

(signed) Mrs Peter Tickner.

[This letter was addressed to the executors of her husband's will, Henry Thompson and John Quirke. They arranged to send the money.]

I hope last month rain has done your gardens good, my beans are giving me a another crop.

VEGETABLES

Broad beans like the cooler weather to grow, so sow now and they will be ready to pick early spring. Before planting give the soil a good liming and some complete fertilizer.

Peas, cabbages and onions mainly white, Peas need a light dressing of lime and complete fertilizer before sowing.

FLOWERS

Seeds of sweet peas can now be sown, prepare the soil as for the vegetables peas.

Seedling available now; Alyssum, Canterbury bells, carnations, cornflowers, delphinium, dianthus, hollyhocks, russel lupins, pansy, viola, primula, snapdragons, stocks and wallflower.

HERBS

BASIL *Ocimum basilican*



The herb Basil can be grown in our warmer months – need a warm sunny spot protect from frost and wind in well drained and moist soil. Avoid over

watering seedling as they are prone to damping off. Can be grown in a pot.

Pick leaves when young. Gather tops as flowers open.

To preserve freeze leaves or dry them. Store leaves in olive oil with salt or dry pack them with salt. Infuse leaves in oil or vinegar.

Health benefits;-

This herb has strong antibacterial properties, and has even been shown to stop the growth of bacteria that is resistant to antibiotics. Its, anti-inflammatory effects may also help combat bowel inflammation and rheumatoid arthritis.

How to use it;- Add fresh leaves to Italian dishes and salads or use to make pesto. Dried basil is fantastic in dressing and soups.

Deciduous trees should be changing there colour this month- it's a good time to observe which trees you would like for your garden, and place an order at your local garden supplier.

VIBURNUM The snowball Tree

Fragrant-flowered relatives of Honeysuckle,



This plant is native to the cooler climates of the northern hemisphere, and welcome worldwide in temperate gardens.


Hydrangea-like white blossom, in the SterileV.o variety, these are formed into great 7.5cm globular cluster that have suggested the popular name Snowball Tree.

There are several other varieties worth growing. Some varieties growing to 5m.

Viburnums need water and a good rich soil to look happy, and to flower well. They are usually propagated from cuttings of half-ripened wood.

The autumn leaves change colour very slowly in colours of reddish brown and orange, in the Viburnum Burkwoodii, variety.


