

Windellama Rural Fire Brigade

Bushfire Danger Season Ended 31 March 2023. Now that we are out of the bushfire danger period, if you are thinking of burning cleared vegetation that you have in a pile there are some rules that you must follow to make it safer for you and your neighbours:

- You must notify all adjoining neighbours and the RFS Fire Control Centre ((02) 6226 3100) at least 24 hours before lighting up. You can also notify the RFS using the online form www.rfs.nsw.gov.au/fire-information/BFDP/burn-notifications
- You must be present to supervise the burn at all times after lighting and ensure it is definitely out before leaving it unattended.
- Piles should not be greater than 2m length or width 1.5 m in height and cleared to 4.5m
- Before lighting consider the weather. Only light the pile if conditions are calm.

All planned burns are registered on a database which means the RFS and other emergency services won't be unnecessarily called out to a smoke sighting which is your pile burn.

Brigade activity

- Two units responded to a car fire on Oallen Ford rd put the fire out limiting damage.
- One unit assisted with multiple other brigades a large fire at Tirranaville.
- Two units responded to a vehicle fire on Oallen Ford rd at 1:30am Crews made the area safe and prevented the fire spreading further in nearby bush.
- · One unit responded to a grass and machinery fire on Cullalla rd
- With high winds across March the brigade also removed and made safe several large branches and trees that had blown on to roads in Windellama.
- Thank you to the community for your donations we recently purchased and installed a multi camera security system with automatic alerts and uploads footage to the cloud.



GARDENING ON WINDELLAMA ROAD MARCH 2023 - By Harry Simm

February 2023 Rainfall at our place.

The downpour received on the 18th saw 11mm in the gauge in very short time. Up until we received the downpour, we had only received 8mm for February. All up for February 23 saw a total of 27.5mm fall. This makes February 23 the lowest drop since 2016 where we received 14mm.

March 2023 Rainfall at our place.

Rain so far has been in short supply at our place, only receiving 13.5mm. Compared to last year in March where we recorded 186mm. So there is a bit of catching up to reach last year's total.

Now is the time to clean gutters. I have a strong feeling we will need every drop of rain we can catch.

Windellama Road Gardening

As you drive along Windellama Road from the Goulburn end to the Windellama end you will notice the variation of the ecology on different properties. The ecology of some blocks of land has been modified by many ways. For example, with the planting of trees, ploughing for different crops, grazing of animals, including native animals and the introduction of feral pests like rabbits and weeds.

Gardening on most properties will mean changing the ecology for gardens to thrive and that in itself, is one of the many challenges.

The other noticeable aspect about this road is that most properties have different yearly rainfall totals and this fact alone, adds another challenge of gardening on Windellama Road.

Jobs for the month at our place

The fruit trees, especially the Plums and Apricots were reaching for the sky, until I cut them back to my head height. I always cut the tops off to keep them to a manageable height and then in winter, I remove all damaged wood and low down branches, plus I open up the centre by removing branches.

I'm also preparing beds for winter vegetables by adding compost and Blood and Bone, but making sure I keep the Ph around 7 or a little less. The only digging I do now is when I'm planting a tree, shrub, or seedlings and seeds.

For trees and shrubs I dig the hole deeper and wider than the root ball. I then put a handful of Gypsum on the bottom. I then fill the hole with water and wait to water soaks away. I then cover the bottom of hole with a mixture of compost and soil that was removed and place tree or shrub root ball in hole and apply a mixture of compost and soil around root ball in layers and water in as I go. Hopefully, this helps in removing air pockets and at the same time firms soil mixture around root ball of planting. I also ensure if plant has been grafted, that where the graft Is joined, it is not covered. This procedure works for us.

When planting seedlings, the procedure is similar but I add an approximate tablespoon full of chicken pellets on top of soil mix under where seedling is to be planted. For seeds, I soak the area where seeds are to be planted, spread seeds and cover with sifted compost or potting mix.

Windellama SES First Aid & CFR

We are presently looking at ways to try to get people interested in joining our combined team, by that I mean, SES and then our Community First Responders Team. You have to be a member of the SES to be eligible to take part in the CFR activities.

The SES and New South Wales Ambulance Service have a Memorandum of Understanding to bring this about. This enables you to be trained by the very capable Ambulance Paramedics, who it must be realised, do so in their own time on many occasions.

As a reminder, once again, we meet every second and third Monday of the month for SES training at 1830 hours (6.30 pm) and 0830 am for Ambulance training every fourth Saturday of the month, so go on, be brave, and come and enlighten your knowledge.

We have had 74 CFR responses in the past 12 months and this is a good effort with the very small number of us.

SES on the other hand has been far less demanding, thank goodness.

Remember folks. try and keep your roofing gutters and valleys clean when safe to do so, as this can help to prevent water damage and fire damage.

If the weather is dry, like now, I also cover the planted seeds with Hessian and keep Hessian damp until seeds germinate. During hot weather keep water up to the seedlings and erecting shade cloth over them when it is really hot. Also, make sure nothing is eaten them like 4 legged feral pests and members of the insect group and also snails and slugs.

Weeds

The new thistles growing have been sprayed and turning brown, as have any other recognised weed weed that's starting to pop up.

Trees

The trees at our place are looking a little water stressed, obvious by the drooping leaves. I'm hanging out for it to rain but if we do not get at least 10 - 20 mm, then its pumping time from the dam. The 1 - 2mm receiving, only penetrates the top soil by 1 - 2 mm, if that!

VEGETABLES;

Broad beans, like to grow in cool climate, and are ready to pick early spring. Before planting give the garden soil a good liming and some compost . they don't like a high nitrogen fertilizer as this promotes leaves at the expense of flowers.

Other vegetables to plant are peas, cabbage, and onions. Peas both climbing and dwarf, give the soil some lime and fertilizer before planting.

FLOWERS;

Seedling to plant now Alyssum, Canterbury bells, carnations, cornflower, delphinium, dianthus, hollyhock, russel lupins, pansy, viola, primula, snapdragon, stocks and wallflower .Sow sweet peas.

It a good time to check the colour of the deciduous tree in your area, to help you choose some for your garden. There is large trees such claret ash, elms, variegated leaved box elder, liquidambar, silver birch, Japanese maple, flowering cherry and crap apple.

Thing to do now;-

Cut off old hellebore leaves and liquid –fertilizer plants to prepare them for winter blooming.

Tip- prune native shrubs that flowered during summer.

Prune hydrangea stems that are still carrying old blooms, cutting just above a pair of fat buds.

Plant new evergreen trees and shrubs to give them time to establish before the arrival of winter.


Feed cymbidium orchids fortnightly with a liquid orchid food to promote good winter blooms.

Sprinkle lime or dolomite over the lawn at the rate of one handful per square metre, which will encourage healthy growth.

Move cold-sensitive pot plants under cover or group them together near a sun-drench wall.

Apply a layer of loose mulch such as sugarcane or straw over the soil to help it maintain its relative warmth. In very cold areas, pull mulch up over the base of plants when heavy frosts are expected.

Mow over fallen leaves before adding them to the compost or garden beds.

the only ones to be interested in viewing the vineyard, as Danny showed us where the local wombat(s) decided to push their way through the bird netting on the surrounds of the vineyard, no doubt to get a better look at the grapes. Danny doesn't think they eat too many, but is a bit unhappy about them letting the birds in, and has to rise early to "check the fences", so to speak.

vegetable gardens, the increased acidity could affect production as vegetables generally prefer a neutral to alkaline soil, so you need to be careful with the amount you apply. Some members have found coffee grounds very effective at controlling snails, and it has the added benefit of not poisoning lizards, birds etc., but soil acidity may need to be monitored.



Carolyn's vegie garden is doing well and she is harvesting a variety of produce, however she is having some trouble with apple scab at present. Tony and Sandra are enjoying a good crop of Chinese quinces and Warren and Judy have an impressive display of sunflowers.

Lynda is busying herself with making apple jelly, and not just any apple jelly. She is using a Huonville red apple, which has deep red flesh, resulting in an intense red apple jelly. Can't wait to try some.
