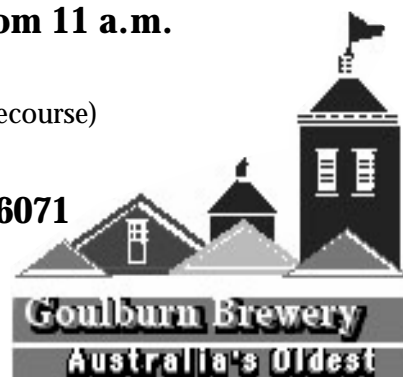

The Annual Cricket Match

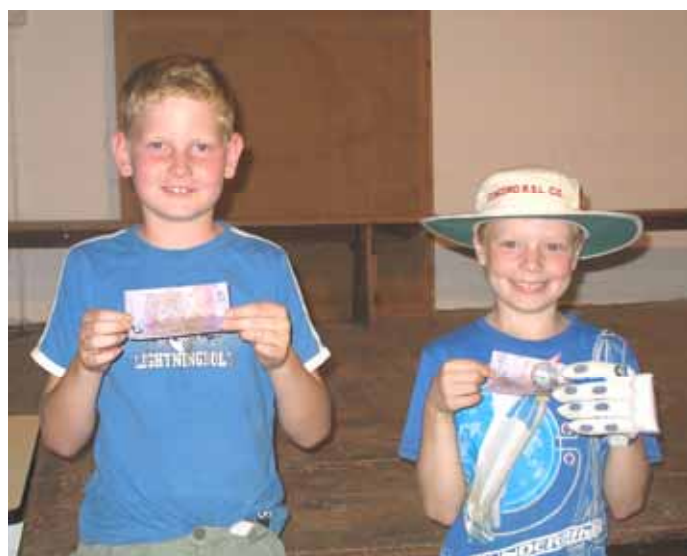
The day was very hot and the teams started to arrive for a 3.00pm start. Bungonia won the toss and decided to bat.
