

#### Weeping Grass (Microlaena stipoides)

This grass is better known by it's botanical name of Microlaena than the common name of Weeping or Rice Grass. It's a very common species and occurs throughout much of Australia, New Zealand and parts of Asia, it is regarded as a native grass to Australia and is probably the most useful grass species we have and it's easy to find in Windellama at the moment as with all the summer rain it has run to seed.



#### Microlaena Seed

Microlaena is excellent high protein stock feed with protein yields around 22%, it responds to European farming methods, and makes a great drought and frost hardy lawn, it will even grow in either full sun or shade, and although it thrives on fertile soils it can still be found on the poorest hard packed clays. It's the first Australian grass that I know of that has had PBR (Plant Breeders Rights) granted, but I think the BEST Microlaena is found in the wild, as wild populations have the strength of genetic diversity.

Weeping Grass is easily recognised by it's bright green colour, seeds with 2 awns (whiskers) one usually longer than the other, and seeding stems that often weep down touching the ground, these stems wrap around your boots and the seed often finds it's way into your socks.

The seed itself is a very good grain, you can eat it straight off the plant and would be a good substitute for any food item that you might choose to make out of rice or wheat, I do know of someone making beer out of Microlaena so what potential we have here in this plant!

#### "Dell" the Koala

Unfortunately "Dell" had to be euthanased just before Christmas, he had been moved to the newly opened Koala hospital in Camden where he underwent surgery to repair his tear ducts that were damaged by the disease Chlamydia however it was not successful, his eyes were constantly becoming re-infected and he had also suffered other organ damage from the disease.

It turns out he was more like 10 to 12 years of age rather than 4 as was first thought so he was a good age for a male Koala, the Camden Koala hospital can be contacted on 02 9351 1798

A major exhibition depicting the changing role of women in Australia and their contribution to Australia's Foreign Service and international diplomacy is on display in Goulburn Library. # DRAFT PLANNING DOCUMENTS ON DISPLAY UNTIL APRIL 2008

- Public comments sought -

Mayor of Goulburn Mulwaree Paul Stephenson is encouraging residents and other stakeholders to comment on new draft planning documents set to guide future development in the area.

The Goulburn Mulwaree Strategy 2020, Draft Goulburn Mulwaree Local Environmental Plan 2007 and associated documents have been developed following extensive consultation with the State Government.

After being endorsed by the NSW Department of Planning, they will be on exhibition for public comment from 19 December 2007 until 11 April 2008. Nine community forums will also be held, where Council staff will be on hand to answer questions.

"As far as I am aware, this is the longest public exhibition period Council has ever provided," Cr Stephenson said.

"I can't stress enough how important it is that people take the time to thoroughly read and, if appropriate, comment on the documents or aspects of them. Some people may have positive feedback, while others will want to raise issues or concerns. After the exhibition of the draft plans, Council will review all submissions received and make individual recommendations regarding each. All submissions will be reviewed and thoroughly considered.

"These are extremely important documents for our community. The Strategy 2020 will guide future development in the area and the Draft Local Environmental Plan 2007 proposes to change land use across the Goulburn Mulwaree area. It is important that residents and other stakeholders know what they contain."

#### BRIEFS FROM COUNCIL MEETING 15 JANUARY 2008

#### **Australian Jazz Convention**

The 62<sup>nd</sup> Australian Jazz Convention held recently in Goulburn has been a success, with more than 700 musicians, delegates and visitors converging on the city. 740 paying participants registered for the Convention, with many choosing to stay for the full week from 26-31 December and further exploring the Goulburn region.

Many local businesses reported to organisers an increased trade during a usually quiet period, and many were complementary about the visitors.

#### **Development Statistics**

Council received more than \$50 million in Development Applications (DAs) throughout 2007. During December alone, Council received 33 DAs to the value of \$19.3 million. The number of applications is four more than received for the same period last year and the value is \$13.5 million higher than in December 2006. Of the 33 applications received, 10 were for new dwellings ranging from \$60,000 to \$270,000 in value.

While the number of DAs received for 2007 were the same as the previous year, the value of the work was up by \$24 million, with a single application worth \$15m. Since 1 July 2007, Council has issued 597 Planning Certificates.

#### Marulan 'at grade' Intersection

Council will consult with the Marulan community over access to the Hume Highway. The consultation will take place before any work is commenced on the Hume Highway/Portland Avenue intersection at Marulan.

#### Water storages

At 30 December 2007, usable water storage for Goulburn was at 63.0%, including

- 40.6% at Pejar Dam
- 94.9% at Sooley Dam.

The daily average consumption for December was 6.31ML in Goulburn, which was below the allowable target for Level 3 restrictions of 7.8ML. Average daily water consumption in Marulan was 214.8kl. In December 105.2mm of rain was recorded at Goulburn Water Treatment Plant, with the city's total usable water storage now at 9814ML.


