

CALLS FOR NOMINATIONS FOR INTERNATIONAL WOMENS DAY

Member for Goulburn Pru Goward today called for nominations for the 2009 NSW Woman of the Year award.

Ms Goward has called on local residents to nominate a woman from the local community whom they feel has made important contributions towards to the growth of the community.

There are so many women whose contributions, successes and achievements encourage and inspire, Ms Goward said, "and honouring women for their contribution to our communities is an important way of building the confidence and pride of all women.

"Marking their contribution and acknowledging them as positive role models is a way of encouraging other women and girls.

"I know many women who deserve to be nominated and I'm sure there are many whose wonderful contributions are invaluable but about whom I don't know.

"Lots of people, both men and women, do amazing things to help others in many ways, and we can't know about them all," Ms Goward said.

"But, if you know a woman whose contribution and achievements should be recognise, please nominate them for the International Women's Day NSW Woman of the Year Award."

10 finalists will be chosen and the NSW Woman of the Year will be announced at a reception hosted by the Premier on 5th March 2009.

EARTH HOUR 2009

Earth Hour 2009 was officially launched in Australia and around the world on 10th December and local Member of Parliament Pru Goward has urged everyone to think about how they can prepare for lights out in March 2009.

Ms Goward said Earth Hour is a great way to promote and learn about energy efficiency not only for one day but as a way of life. "Energy efficiency is a challenge for us all and we should all get into the habit of turning lights off when we leave a room, not leaving our appliances on stand-by and installing energy efficient light globes," Ms Goward said.

"Earth Hour is an amazing event organised by the World Wildlife Foundation (WWF) to make us aware of our energy use and how we can make a difference to climate change by changing our habits for the good of our planet.

Earth Hour is a symbolic event that encourages us to switch our lights off for an hour on **Saturday 28 March between 8.30pm and 9.30pm.**

"It's also throws down a challenge to us all to work out how we can reduce our consumption of energy on a daily basis."

Organised by the WWF, its estimated around 2.2 million Australians took part in the inaugural Earth Hour in 2007.

Up to 100 million people from 370 cities around the world were involved in 2008 with the aim of reaching a billion people next year.

Busy Time

Claypit Road area

Well we managed to have a quiet Christmas and New Year, but that was about all. On January 6th smoke was spotted in the Claypit Road area. Some calls were made to the Brigade number and others to Brigade members, this can cause a delay, as it is possible that there could be more than one fire for the Brigade to check out. This was a serious fire and without the quick support of Goulburn RFS who arranged immediate backup and resources, this would undoubtedly have been a lot worse.

The Brigades who attended were Bungonia, Big Hill, Taylor's Creek, Tarago, Middle Arm, Tarlo, Parkesbourne, Marulan & Mulwaree RAFT.

Additional Services that were called on were Group 4, Air Bombers, Spotter Aircraft, Upper Lachlan Bulk Tanker, Police and the Southern Tablelands Zone Personnel.

Our Brigade had approximately 26 members attending this incident both during the day and night, in addition to personnel on the fire ground, there were approximately 25 who assisted with catering, some making cakes and biscuits at home, as well as volunteers at the fire station preparing sandwiches, tea, coffee and other duties. Our Communications Officers voice was becoming fainter each day and deserved a well-earned rest from the radio

Bush Fire Danger Season 1st October to 31st March

With the Bush Fire Danger Season due to begin on 1st October to 31st March there are precautions that must be taken. More information can be found by accessing the Rural Fire Service web site (www.rfs.nsw.gov.au). During the Bush Fire Danger Season, fires in the open air are restricted. This means that barbecues and campfires may only be used under certain conditions.

Total Fire Bans

Total Fire Bans are declared during the Bush Fire Danger Period and are notified to the public on radio and television, information can also be found on the Brigade web site www.windellamarfs.com.au. This means that no fire can be lit during this period. Remember if you fail to comply with the fire regulations, you can be fined up to \$5,500 or twelve months jail.

Lightning Strikes

Remember lightning strikes cause many problems in our area, so once again please be on the lookout for smoke rising after the storm has passed. Fire can still start days after the storm. If you notice smoke give us a call.

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Road 92 Update

December 2008 update

Stage two construction

A \$22.5 million contract for the second stage of the upgrade, comprising the nine kilometre section from 44 kilometres west of Hames Road (near the Touga Road junction just east of the Bulee mountain area at Billy's Hill) to the village of Nerriga, was awarded to Nace Civil Engineering Pty Ltd in July 2007.



This stage includes major improvements, widening, realigning and sealing to the existing steep and narrow section from Bulee Gap to the Endrick River. The major earthworks and drainage structures are progressing well and traffic is being progressively switched onto the new alignment. A 1km length of new pavement was sealed in December 2008 near Billy's Hill.

The fauna underpass east of Endrick River Bridge and several of the retaining walls are complete. Three spans of the concrete bridge deck of the new 60 metre, four span Bulee Bridge have now been poured.

The RTA is planning to close Main Road 92 in mid February near Bulee Gap between Endrick River and Touga Road. (Monday 23rd Feb 6am to Sunday 1st March 6pm) This essential closure is required to construct retaining walls on the steep and narrow western approach to the new Bulee Bridge site. The RTA is consulting with residents, business operators, emergency service providers and regular road users concerning the proposed closure. The closure will be widely advertised with extensive

signposting to inform stakeholders of the closure. For enquiries regarding the road closure, please contact the NACE Civil Engineering Pty Ltd site engineer, Clinton Woods on 0412 490 602.

The 5km section from the Endrick River to Nerriga village is well advanced and 2.5km of bitumen sealing was completed this month.

Construction of Stage 2 is expected to be completed in mid 2009.

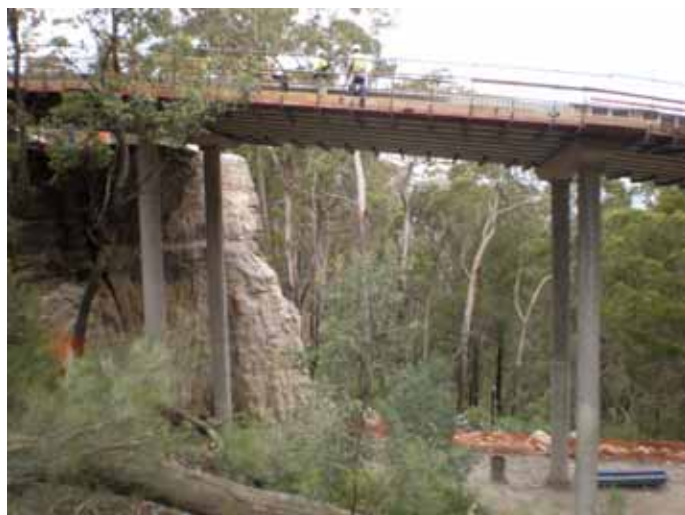
Stage three construction tendering

Tenders for upgrading and sealing the remaining 20 kilometre section from Tianjara to Billy's Hill closed on 27 August and are presently being assessed.

Changes to road conditions

Motorists are advised to drive carefully throughout the construction area and also on the remaining section of gravel road as the road conditions are variable. Particular care should be taken in wet weather as the unsealed sections of the road can be slippery and suitable only for 4WD vehicles.
