

**WE NEED** warm comfortable nesting homes for our animals-

\*You can help by saving old towels, rucksacks, sloppy joes, woollen jumpers, blankets, pillowcases, knitting yarn and sheepskin pieces. All these should be of natural fibre I.e. cotton or wool - synthetic materials are an irritant and give some animals skin problems.

**WE NEED** handy men and women who can make items such as-

\*Wire cages, larger aviaries, aquariums [for reptiles]

\*Possum boxes, nesting boxes for various sized birds

\*Knitted or material pouches of varying sizes for possums, wombats and joey kangaroos and wallabies.

**WE NEED** regular supplies of whole food for bats, kookaburras, tawny frogmouths and birds of prey.

You can help by collecting, or offering to breed some of these foods:-

\* Mice, rats, mealworms and earthworms

\*Insects such as cockroaches, grasshoppers, beetles, caterpillars, earwigs; crickets and other creepy crawlies.

**WE NEED** natural feed for our leaf, nut and pollen eating creatures-

\* You can help by growing native plants and letting us know where we can obtain the following-

\* Flowers, nuts & new green shoots from plants such as grevillea, melaleuca, eucalyptus etc. For possums and nut eaters such as gang-gangs, rosellas and parrots.

\*Blossoms of anything native for honeyeaters and lorikeets.

\*You can help also by collecting any of the above for our foster carers.

**WE NEED** secure havens for our animals and birds for when they are ready to be released-

You can help by telling us about safe release sites. Ideally-

\* The area should be large enough for the bird or animal to enjoy its freedom.

\* It should already contain members of the same species for social and breeding purposes.

\* There should be reliable water and ample

native vegetation for food and shelter.

\*The site should be far away from roads, towns and other man made hazards.

\* A good site should remain undisturbed by logging, farming and other changes.

### **NEW SUPPORT FOR LOCAL COMMUNITY GROUPS**

Community groups and charities can now apply for donations of up to \$1000 through a new donation system launched by the Veolia Mulwaree Trust.

The Trust's successful grant program, which has provided more than \$3.4 million to 240 local community groups and organisations in recent years, will continue to provide grant funding.

Veolia Mulwaree Trust Chairman Paul Stephenson said the Trust believed that many more groups could be helped through a simpler application process and has announced that the Trust will now give community groups the alternative of applying for a one-off donation.

"There are many small, hard-working groups out there in the community and we recognise that having to complete a lengthy application form may put off some from applying for the assistance they deserve," Mr Stephenson said.

"The new one-page donation form gives these community-based organisations an opportunity to receive a donation of up to \$1000 to support their activities."

Organisations with specific projects valued at more than \$1000 can apply through the Trust's Community Grant Program.

Mr Stephenson said the Trust was available to assist schools, sporting groups, community health services, charities, churches and all other incorporated, not-for-profit community organisations with community based projects.

The Trust's funding is provided by Veolia Environmental Services, owners of the Woodlawn Bioreactor near Tarago, and distributed to organisations within the Goulburn Mulwaree, Palerang, Upper Lachlan, Wingecarribee, Oberon, Shoalhaven and Wollondilly Council areas.

## Alpacas - Spiritual & sentient beings

We, my husband and I breed Alpacas near Lake George in NSW and I really believe there is something special about Alpacas, I regard them in the same category as dolphins and elephants.

Besides being very intelligent they gaze at you with their big blue or brown eyes and try to tell you the meaning of life. Certainly one can communicate with them telepathically. We have two wethers ( de sexed males) whom I have bottle raised and they are pets and act rather like dogs, even coming in the house and also coming when I call them.

WE RAISE ALL THE ALPACAS, HOLISTICALLY, NATURALLY AND ORGANICALLY. There is not a chemical in or on the land, 65 acres or in or on the Alpacas, forty-one at this point in time. this land has been free of chemicals since 1997 at least and we do not vaccinate or drench the alpacas but give them a special mix consisting of oaten and lucerne chaff, goodies such as garlic, apple cider vinegar, seaweed meal, dolomite etc and they are given vitamins ADE and cod liver oil by mouth every so often, at stressful times or in bad weather conditions.

They are shorn once a year in December, at the very beginning as it is not too hot or too cold then, by a special alpaca shearer, done on a table. At that time their toenails are also clipped. Being browsers they eat grass but also all shrubs and trees, we have native pasture which is particularly good for them. It is a good

idea to have shelters, three sided and a roof for them when the weather is cold and wet and ours do run for these at the slightest drop of rain!

An ideal creature for small farms or tree change life style, they are very easy care. However you need at least two or they will pine and die! Their fleece is a marvellous commodity and some terrific garments, doonas, etc can be made and there is a big call for the fleece from home spinners and weavers.

I do not like cruelty in any shape or form and abhor castration without painkiller or anaesthetic, embryo transfer( to get more creatures quickly) and horror of horrors, they are just starting to eat them. I know if we go down this path we shall not do ourselves any good only a great disservice and we should look after this marvellous creature to the best of our ability.




