Windellama News

On Monday 21st May the Windellama News team held a meeting to discuss and resolve the problems of production of the News that currently are in a state of limbo.

As promised in the last issue we have decided to print this issue in a smaller state (A5) to gauge your response and also to reduce the cost of printing this issue. It was noted by some of the delivery team that it will fit better into letter boxes; but were also worried about the response from our advertisers who are crucial in keeping the Windellama News ongoing. I was also worried about the size of the fonts whether they would be legible to everyone. We definitely want feedback of your thoughts of this size of newsletter.

Responses from residents filling in their delivery notices has been positive of late with some wonderful comments; not to mention the wonderful dollar donations from almost everyone. I am truly humbled by your positive comments and the total amount of donations - just over \$800 at the time of writing this. This will go towards the cost of out-sourcing our printing at present. Any funds left over will go towards the purchase of a new photocopier.

Gary Johnson advised the meeting on the various costs of replacements and it was decided that the old photocopier be repaired so as Roger from Business Requisites not be out of pocket for the parts he has purchased. This copier will then be available for the community to use. Roger has advised that he cannot guarantee how long this copier will last as the existing parts are old and difficult to get.

We will still be applying to the Mulwaree Trust for a grant for a new photocopier. This however is not a guaranteed success, but we only can try. If we are successful then we have to address the question of where to house it, keeping mice out of it, keeping moisture out of it, retraining volunteers on the operation of it. These small hurdles will be overcome upon our successful purchase.

It was also discussed to hold an annual fundraiser specifically for the Windellama News, the proposal to hold an Oktoberfest with a home brew competition and also a beer tasting competition; but this will have to be ratified with the Windellama Progress Association executive.

Cathy and myself offered to take phone calls from residents who cannot get to either post or drop off their notices. We understand that it is easier to

telephone but there would not be anything in writing to cross-check with once we delete them from our answering machines. We of course would not want to delete you from our lists.

If you decide to phone us, please remember to advise us of your Surname, Rural Gate Number, not your lot number, in your address. A property name is also a good reference for us.

We do have funds to cover outsourcing of the printing at present, but this cannot continue indefinitely as our income per month does not match the printing cost per month. We definitely need to purchase a new photocopier. A laser printer is out of the question as replacement toner and drum are too expensive, even if leased.

Hopefully this is keeping you all in the loop and we, the team, again must thank all those who have responded with their notices, emails and kind words, and again we thank everyone who have very kindly donated to us.


