

Sunning Hill

In 1837 in London an, 18 year old Thomas Middleton pleaded guilty at the Old Bailey for stealing there in 3 sovereigns and 2 half sovereigns, and, having been 'let off' some eighteen months earlier for a similar offence he was sentenced to 'Transportation for Life'. He arrived that same year aboard the 'Charles Kerr'. He apparently was assigned to somewhere in the Bungonia area as he received a Ticket of Leave from the Bungonia Bench in 1847, from Goulburn Bench in 1849 and again from Bungonia before being 'Pardoned' in 1849.

In 1845 he married Lydia Fuller (she was 20 years of age) and in 1846 they had a son, Thomas Matthew who in 1869 married Louisa Muffet (daughter of another local, Charles Robert).

Possibly around the time he married Louisa he built a humble bark roofed dwelling to live in and from there they raised six children. This dwelling was the beginings of 'Sunning Hill'. One of their children was my Great Grandmother Charlotte Amy Croker. Their only son, Thomas, and youngest daughter Florence (known as Flo) didn't marry and in 1937 the present, more modern dwelling was built. Also in 1937, Flo's daughter Muriel, known as Maidy, married Frank Brice.

Frank added more rooms to the original 'Bark Roofed' residence and added a bit more as time went on, and raised five children there. They all went to Windellama School, with the exception on a son, Errol, who contracted an illness at an early age and received his schooling by correspondence.

The interesting thing is that the original 'Bark Roofed' building is still there. I even stayed there on a few nights *as an under 10 year old) and was not aware of it until I spoke to the youngest daughter Laurice a few months back. A photo is in existence of this building and I have been promised a copy, but alas, it hasn't arrived as yet.

Hopefully, we will be able to have an excursion in the foreseeable future if permission from the present owners is received.



In Your June Garden

This month clean up dead grasses and flowers don't put seeds head into your compost.

Compost your lawn clipping, animal manure. shrubs and tree pruning. Don't use newspaper fresh sawdust or wood shaving, or Eucaltptus leaves or pine needles. Don't forget to add lime, and thin layer of topsoil.

Roses are in the shops this month perfect time to plant, make sure you water them in well. Society Garlic and chives are often recommended as companions for roses to ward off aphids.

Fruit trees can be planted now. Because Fruit trees are bare rooted, water them in well and prune the top by one third, this helps them get established.



Meyer lemons are suitable for our area. Keep away from cold westerly winds and the southern heat, and protect from frost. They can be grown in a large pot. They like acid soil, feed them in spring with citrus fertilizer.

FLOWERS

Seedlings of stock, pansy, viola, primula, wallflowers, Russell lupins, delphiniums, foxgloves, Iceland poppies, sweet William and calendula can be planted now and will flower in spring.

VEGETABLES

Broad beans, peas, and onions seedlings can go in now.



Lift and divide Rhubarb crowns, give them plenty of manure and compost. Strawberries can be divided now, cut off the yellow leaves. Asparagus crowns can be planted now. Watch for white cabbage moths, you can spray with Dipel.

Place hollowed out potatoes in a protected spot to bring out slaters. Spray weekly with Dipel to kill all leaf-munching caterpillars and grubs.

Scale looks like small pimples on stems and leaves, and attacks a number of plants, feeding on sap and reducing plant vigour. Prune off the most affected stems if the infestation is bad.

Ants are often a sign of scale, but they're not the problem- you need to eradicate the scale using an oil spray, which smothers them.

WHITE OIL SPRAY

Make a concentrate by mixing one part dishwashing liquid to four parts sunflower oil. When ready to spray, add I tablespoon concentrate to IL water. If the temperature is very hot it may burn foliage.
