

Hello residents and ratepayers

Another busy round of Council related meetings has been and gone and we are now working towards developing the Draft Management Plan for 2010 - 2011. Also an important part of future planning is the current round of Community Strategic Planning meetings. We have about three to go and we thank all who have attended the various venues and who have been prepared to add their ideas to helping Council develop a blueprint for the future years up to 2022.

Heritage issues, renewable energy opportunities, how to assess appropriate land use have been some of the current topics being discussed. Many residents are passionate about our local heritage and are willing to be part of the debate. We all need to be aware of the relevant heritage buildings that not only maintain our links with the past but are also a vital draw card for local tourism which impacts significantly on our local economy.

We also need to be working towards a sustainable environment that is economically feasible. Council is currently having discussions with Ingenero Pty Ltd, an Australian company specialising in solar power installations. It was decided at the April 20 Council meeting to obtain further information before possibly entering into a Dedd of Agreement with Ingenero for the supply, installation and maintenance of renewable energy products to households and business in the Goulburn Mulwaree area.

Appropriate land use is just one of the many challenges facing planners when interpreting the Local Environmental Plan (LEP). The NSW Department of Planning has released an options paper looking at ways to make sure the LEP remains a robust, up to date and relevant planning tool. Some proposed

administrative changes include

- 1. Clarifying the difference between secondary dwelling and dual occupancy development
- 2. Simplifying the formula for the calculation of retail floor area (in enterprise developments)
- 3. Achieving consistency between the Heritage Item and the relic definitions in the LEP.

There are more amendments planned which barely impact on Goulburn Mulwaree LEP 2009

but Council is concerned about some changes to group definitions which will impact on the permissable and prohibited land uses within the zone tables of our LEP and Councillors have requested that the Department clarify responsibility for these proposed amendments.

On a lighter note I would like to draw your attention to the fact that 2010 is the Year of Women in Local Government and that GMC will feature profiles of women within our Council - namely, Mayor Carol James and Crs Nina Dillon and Margaret O'Neill. As the year progresses there will also be some associated functions.

In the interests of promoting a healthy lifestyle there will be a Community Cycle Event to be held in Spetember.

The end of the year CABARET DANCE will be held next Saturday 4th December and hope that there will be a good roll-up to finish the year off on a high note.



Burning-off now permitted with regulations

While the fire season has finished and permits are not required for burning off from the 1st April 2010, there are still regulations that must be followed. Fines can apply if regulations are not carried out.

Yass **MUST** be notified 24 hours before you light the fire, during business hours 9am to 5pm and by 3.30pm on Friday afternoons.

Your immediate neighbours must also be notified.

Notify the Brigade as a courtesy to save time, if smoke is spotted.

What's happening online with Goulburn Library?

Your Tutor – help for your assignments, exams and homework

School is back, with a whole new collection of assignments and homework to be done. But what if you're having trouble with the questions, or need some guidance on how to approach your answer?

Yourtutor is a unique, free learning service offered by Southern Tablelands Regional Library that connects students to qualified tutors for individual conversations about homework, assignments, exam preparation and study questions. The service is free to all local students with a Southern Tablelands Regional Library card, which is used to log in at www.strl.nsw.gov.au. You can connect from any internet connection — at home or in the library — between 4 pm and 8 pm, Monday to Friday.

Yourtutor's Online Classroom allows expert, real-life tutors to review specific homework and assignment questions with students using controlled chat, an interactive whiteboard, a file sharing too and web browsing. Yourtutor is designed to help Years 4-12, as well as TAFE and first year Uni students get 'unstuck' with questions about Maths, Science, English, Research, and Study Skills.

To access Yourtutor, go to www.strl.nsw.gov.au. Select Your Tutor from the Menu on the left hand side of the screen. Then follow the prompts to gain access to the service. For more information about Yourtutor, contact the Library on 4823-4435, or ask staff at any of our branch libraries in Goulburn, Crookwell, Gunning or Yass.




