

Hello residents and ratepayers

Well, one year down and three to go of this current Council term. The annual Mayoral elections were held at the September 15 meeting and the status quo remains. We continue to be led by Mayor Carol James and Deputy Mayor Bob Kirk.

Serrated Tussock Hotline



Perhaps one of the more important initiatives introduced by Council during the past month has been the active stand taken in the war against noxious weeds. Goulburn Mulwaree Council has launched a new phone hotline encouraging residents to report outbreaks of serrated tussock both on Council land and on private property.

The number is 48234567.

This phone hotline, along with a new weeds information display in Council's Civic Centre foyer, was launched at a Rural Urban night, hosted by the Rotary Club of Goulburn.

The hotline will be trialed during serrated tussock's flowering period of spring and summer and, as a requirement of Council's funding agreement, Council staff will investigate all complaints.

Serrated Tussock is a highly invasive weed that will invade pastures, native grasslands and threatens both agricultural production and native ecological systems. It is one of only 20 weeds to make the Weeds of National Significance list. Serrated tussock infestations

left untreated will rapidly form a monoculture that serves as a seed source for properties within a 20km radius.

According to Malcolm Ross, GMC's Noxious Weeds Officer, 2008 had been a terrible year for serrated tussock. Landowners can help to reduce the impact of this highly invasive weed by implementing a weed management program which includes correctly identifying the plant and creating a weed control strategy to reduce the serrated tussock population.

Creative Arts Scholarships

Local artists are being given the chance to apply for the latest round of funding from the Jennifer Lamb Veolia Creative Arts Scholarship.

Applications will be accepted from emerging artists seeking to pursue further study and practising artists seeking to develop a body of work.

Two scholarships are awarded annually. The first is a study in an artistic discipline aimed at emerging artists, which provides up to \$5,000 over four years.

The second scholarship is for a practising artist to assist with the development of a major body of work, which provides up to \$5,000 over two years

Goulburn Mulwaree Council administers the Jennifer Lamb Veolia Creative Arts Scholarship program on behalf of the Veolia Mulwaree Trust.

Applications will be received until 5pm Friday 13 November 2009 and should be addressed to the General Manager, Goulburn Mulwaree Council, Locked Bag 22, Goulburn NSW 2580. Application forms and copies of the Scholarship Guidelines are available from Council's Customer Service Counter at the Civic Centre, or from Council's website www.goulburn.nsw.gov.au.



La Granja Holistic Alpacas

Spring has sprung at La Granja, one chicken has five little chicks and we have three geese sitting. The guinea fowl and ducks are more difficult as they do not seem very inclined to sit on their eggs.

Leti, a black alpaca had her baby last Thursday and we have two more due, one any moment and the other due in October. Leti did not go into labour until feed time in the evening and usually if they go this late you know you have a problem. We could see a little nose but no little feet. She kept coming up and butting me with her head as if to say please help me get this baby out. We had her in the run and she cushed down and I held her head whilst Heroides went in and investigated. enough he was there but with his little legs stuck under and folded back. managed to gently ease them round and out and with Leti pushing helped get him to his shoulders. She then gave one big push and he slithered out. We then hung around until she passed the afterbirth at about 9pm and then left Mum and Bub in the shelter with food and water.

He was fine and we called him Artemio, he has one little ear inside out which we are working on and massaging every day to get straight. He is a little naughty and jumps on his aunties and chases magpies and chickens. His big sister Arco Iris (same father and mother) absolutely adores him and sits by him all the time. She is 17 months old and a maiden so it does her good to see what goes on. The other young girl Aurora is waiting for Katinka to give birth which should be any day now, she was due the same day.

Last weekend four young boys went to their new home, two were about 18 months and two just weaned at nearly 7 months. They will be with six others and it is a lovely caring home with similar methods, so I was happy but it is always sad to see them go when they have been your babies.

I had a close call on the weekend I was taking some corn to feed the new chicks and at the door to their run was about quarter of an inch away from treading on a tiger snakes tail. Luckily it slid away, but one has to be very aware now with the warmer weather as they

are out and about. Interestingly the snake slid in with the chicken and this is the first time I have seen a full on fight between the two and the chicken well and truly won. !! It is lovely to see all the blossom and new growth.
