

TID BITS FOR YOUR GARDEN

It's safe to plant out potted perennials appearing in garden centres as the weather warms.

BUSH FIRE DANGER PERIOD COMMENCES ON 1ST OCTOBER 2015 SOUTHERN TABLELANDS ZONE

NSW Rural Fire Service SOUTHERN TABLELANDS ZONE has declared the start to the statutory Bush Fire Danger Period (BFDP) as at 1st OCTOBER 2015.

From October 1, any person wishing to light a fire in GOULBURN MULWAREE, UPPER LACHLAN and YASS VALLEY Local Government areas will require a permit.

During a Total Fire Ban however, no fires of any kind may be lit even if you hold a permit.

PERMITS REQUIRED From October 1 Fines can apply if regulations are not carried out.

The Coming Fire Season

A Seasonal Bushfire Outlook report released early September has labelled the Southern Tablelands district as an area with "above normal" bushfire potential. In assessing the risk, the Bushfire and Natural Hazards Cooperative Research Centre took into account factors such as recent rainfall, long term rainfall deficit and long term climate drivers. Leading into this year, many areas have consistently received below average annual rainfall across successive years. This has produced a cumulative reduction in soil moisture levels and increasingly dry forests and grasslands. Take Care: We would like to remind you that extreme care must be taken when working outside such as welding or using grinders and in particular when driving in long grass or using a slasher or mower as all these events can easily result in the start of a fire.

Over the Last Month

The Captain Rex Hockey advised that there was one incident in the last month which resulted when a disused campfire reignited after use from strong winds.

October In Your Garden By Irene Turner



This month is regarded as one of the busiest times for the home gardener. The flowering trees, and shrubs should be in bloom. Fruit trees should be in full flower, if you haven't spray your nectarine and peach trees for curly leaf it is too late to spray now.

VEGETABLES-

Seeds;- sow carrots, parsnips, beetroot, peas, cabbage, silver beet, radish.

Cucumber, zucchini, melon-rockmelons and watermelon, start the seed in pots as they like a warm soil to grow in, plant them out in November in a sunny position and in a garden containing plenty of compost.

Pumpkins and squash also like a warm soil to grow in, start them off in seed pots.

Parsley and most herbs can be grown from seed this month. Capsicums and chilli seeds can also be grown this month. Watch for frost, cover the plants if they are in the garden.

Sweet Corn likes a dressing of compost complete fertilizer just before sowing the seeds. Plant the seeds in a block, it helps pollen from the male flowers or tassels at the top of the plants have the best change of falling on the female flowers half way up the stems. Space rows 60cm apart. Sweet corn cobs are suitable to freeze.

Tomatoes, I would start them off this month in a green house and plant late October to November when the soil is warmer, and cover if there is any sign of frost.

Beans, bush and climbing can go in now. I grow purple king climbers and have a good croup.

Celery seedlings can go in now, but watch for slugs and snails they love them.

If growing cabbages or broccoli watch for white butterflies cover with a net if you get to many.

FLOWERS-

Agertum, alyssum asters, balsam, carnation, cosmos, dianthus, gypsophila, larkspur, linaria, lobelia, livingstone daisy, marigold, nasturtium, pansy, petunias, phlox, schizanthus(poor man's Orchid), portulaca, snapdragons, verbena. Seeds or seedling can go in now.

Dahlia;- seedling of dwarf varieties, grow to 60cm in height, and come in colours of yellow, reds and pinks. These don't require staking.

The taller dahlias have a tuber which come in different styles and colours growing from 1.5-2metres in height and requiring a firm stake for support. Give them some compost to grow in.

LOOK OUT FOR FRUIT FLY- For a bait make a 5mm hole halfway up a small plastic bottle. Put in half a teaspoon of vegemite and some diluted fruit juice, replaced lid and hang in your tree. About 1 for 4 trees. Refresh fornightly.

Roses- repeat-flowering are in bloom this month. Make sure the roots are kept moist, a deep watering once a week and apply a liquid fertilizer for the flowering plants every fortnight. Deadhead spent blooms regularly to encourage a succession of flowers, and pick off any diseased leaves. Keep on top of aphid outbreaks, too with a quick squirt of soap spray.

OALLEN FORD BRIDGE

The building and opening

Up until 1934 the road between Windellama and Nerriga could not be used on a regular basis due to the condition of Oallen Ford crossing. There was no bridge over the Shoalhaven River then and when the water level was too high a detour had to be made via Braidwood.

The matter of a bridge came before Mulwaree council on a number of occasions but as it was on the border with Tallaganda shire and the proximity to Nerriga it was felt it was more a matter for Tallaganda shire.

James Dunn of Nerriga and others put a petition to the councils and in early 1934 an often heated meeting was held on the banks of the river near the crossing. Following the meeting and



representations to the NSW. Government the go ahead was given to build a bridge. The cost of £1600 being funded by a grant of £1000 and the remainder of the cost to be divided between the two shire councils.

The designs were drawn up by the Engineers of the two councils and Mr. J. Harrison the Mulwaree shire engineer supervised the work on the bridge. The bridge is of five

spans and over 120 tons of concrete was used for the piers. Due to there being no hold ups in the construction because of bad weather the cost of the bridge was just over £1430.

For years the crossing of the Shoalhaven River was a risky endeavour but the bridge opened up the road between not only Windellama and Nerriga but provided a road from Goulburn to the coast.

Over 200 district people were present for the opening at 3 pm on 7 October 1935. The official party was made up of J.M. Tully and H.J. Bate MLA's in the NSW. parliament, the Mayor of Goulburn Ald. T.P. Manion, President of Mulwaree Shire Cr. J.J. Walsh, Mayor of Braidwood Ald J.J. Roberts, President of Tallaganda council W.U. Alley, President of Clyde council Cr. Boag and the Minister for Local Government Mr. E.S. Spooner.

After Mr. Spooner cut the blue ribbon and declared the bridge open a discussion was held to decide which car would be the first to drive over the newly opened bridge. While the party were making this decision a motor car could be heard in the distance and then a very travel stained old touring car came into view, bounced over the stones on the Nerriga side and rattled across the bridge without knowing the honour they had bestowed on themselves which would have had some people remembering the incident at the opening of the Sydney Harbour Bridge a few years earlier. The occupants of the car were Mr E. Shaw, Mr C. Pryke, Mr H. Alcock and Mr T. Alcock all of Dumbleton who had been camping near Nerriga and were unaware of the new bridge or the opening ceremony.

After the opening ceremony a dinner was held at the Commercial Hotel at Nerriga followed by a dance, these two functions being organised by the Nerriga Progress Association.

Oallen Ford Bridge opens to traffic

Traffic is flowing across the new Oallen Ford Bridge. The two lane concrete bridge replaces the existing bridge and causeway crossing of the Shoalhaven River. The new GOULBURN MULWAREE COUNCIL

bridge was built five metres higher than the previous structure to ensure it remains open unless there is extreme flooding in the Shoalhaven River.

The new approaches have straightened out some tight bends and the previous load restrictions

will no longer apply.



The project cost \$3.2 million in total. The NSW State Government contributed \$2.7 million to cover the cost of the bridge and Goulburn Mulwaree Council has funded the approaches.

Mr Warwick Bennett, General Manager of Goulburn Mulwaree Council thanked the local community for their understanding during the construction period.

New Oallen Ford Bridge 'Council appreciates the patience of local residents, especially in the last phase of the project when the road was closed, adding to daily travel times.'

The project was a combined effort by bridge building contractor, CivilBuild, Consulting Engineers Land Team, local earthmoving contractor, Divalls and Council's own work crews.

'Each is to be congratulated for the successful completion of this project, in what were at times, trying conditions.'

Mr Bennett went on to say, 'Windellama district residents are delighted with the new bridge and improved access over the Shoalhaven River. Goulburn residents are looking forward to a smooth drive to the Coast in time for summer.'

It is eighty years since the Oallen Ford Road had a new bridge. Workers discovered the original commemorative stone marking the opening of the previous bridge in September 1935.

There will be an official ceremony to open the new Oallen Ford Bridge on Thursday 12 November.

Springtime in the Bee Yard Bob Shaw

REQUEENING YOUR BEEHIVE

Bob Shaw.

Inspections of your beehive at any time of year can reveal that the bees are becoming savage, or that the hive is losing productivity due to reduced numbers of workers in the colony.

A queen bee left undisturbed by man, can live up to about 5 or 6 years. As the queen ages, her egg-laying capacity diminishes, as does her pheromone or queen substance production. If she was poorly mated, or is very old, she may exhaust her stored sperm supply, and begin laying only unfertilised eggs, resulting in very high numbers of drones in the hive.

All of these problems can be fixed by introducing a new , young queen to the colony. This can be achieved by buying a queen from a reputable queen breeder , or by breeding your own new queens . Probably the easiest method for the backyard beekeeper is buy a queen from a breeder , who with some input from you can determine and supply the best race of bee for your needs . Queen bees range in price from about \$20 to around \$28 and are sent by express post , to your door . They come in a small cage with some attendant workers , and a supply of food in the form of a plug in one end of the cage. Some queen breeders will mark the queen with a spot of white paint on her thorax to facilitate her easier location in the future. This may cost a little extra , but is worth it .

To introduce the new queen into the colony, it is first necessary to find and remove the old queen, since the new and old queens will fight, usually to the death, if they are both in the hive. Usually the young queen wins, but may be injured, and rejected by the bees, thus wasting your money and possibly resulting in the eventual death of the hive, since the queen is the only fertile egg layer in the colony.

Some beekeepers like to leave the colony queenless for 24 hours before inserting the cage with the new queen , I prefer to kill the old queen and then immediately insert the caged new queen between two centrally located brood combs , with the food plug end of the cage angled slightly upward.

The bees in the cage, and those in the hive, will eat through the food plug releasing the new queen into the colony, where she will quickly begin laying. During the release process the hive bees will communicate with the queen and her attendants who will pass on the new queens' pheromones, which will have an immediate calming effect on the hive bees.

The beekeeper should leave the new queen and the colony alone for a week to ten days ,before checking to see if the new queen is laying eggs , as early disturbance can result in rejection if the new queen .

MYOPATHY

'An invisible death sentence for our wildlife'

Domestic cats and dogs pose a serious threat to wildlife because of their natural hunting instincts. Many pet owners don't think about what their pets get up to outside, but even the most docile of cats or dogs can chase, prey on or kill native wildlife because they are natural hunters and carnivores.

We are all aware of the obvious physical injuries that can be inflicted by a cat or dog attack, but many are

unaware of the (mainly) dog inflicted invisible killer – myopathy.

What is myopathy?

It is the collective term for many and various muscular conditions which can affect not only humans, but all other animal species.

Myopathy in macropods. (Wallabies, wallaroos and kangaroos)

How does it happen?

When a muscle is exerted (used) its metabolism changes from aerobic (uses oxygen) to anaerobic (uses stored energy in the muscles). This leads to the build up of lactic acid causing acidosis. Lactic acid in the bloodstream drops the pH in the body, affecting heart output. If the heart does not pump oxygen to the muscle it starts to die. When the

muscle dies over the next 7 days, it releases a product called myoglobin (breakdown product of muscle). Myoglobin damages the excretion part of the kidney (the renal tubule). Other organs are affected: the lungs become congested and bleed. The liver becomes swollen and pale. Death will occur within 2 - 14 days after the stressful incident.

Myopathy in macropods happens when an animal is under extreme stress, for example when it is being attacked or chased by a dog (either domestic or feral). It is natural for us to think that if the dog did not catch the animal then no harm has been done; the dog had a good run, and the animal got away. However nothing is further from the truth, the animal does not have to be injured directly to develop myopathy. In reality the animal may have got away, but will not escape a painful and slow death. Usually we will not see an animal in this state, as it will go somewhere quiet and out of sight to die.

It is very unfortunate that this situation takes place on a regular basis in the country, as it is avoidable (when it comes to domestic dogs), just by keeping them contained in a yard at night when most Australian native animals are more active. During daylight hours when your dog may be 'out and about' with you, do not allow it to chase native animals.

Every cat and dog deserves a safe home where it is loved, cared for and kept free from hazards. It is also possible to help your pets and wildlife co-exist safely. So, please be alert to what is taking place around you, and help our native animals survive in an ever diminishing natural environment.
