


## Book Launch in Nerriga on Easter Saturday

The Nerriga Craft & Museum Centre Trustees are proud to announce the book launch of "Nerriga, On The Wool Road". It will be a big event on Easter Saturday, 16th April.

Pam Radowitz first published the book, a very good history of Nerriga, in 1991 and many have sought copies but the book was out of print. Hans Radowitz, graciously gave permission to enhance, colourise and reprint the book with an additional supplement to add the events in Nerriga since 1991. Many locals were asked to help complete the supplement with photos, stories and facts. A landholder in the community has a publishing business in Belrose, (Print Direction), and took a personal interest in printing the book to the highest of standards. The supplement and reprint have gained from local input throughout its creation.



From Wool Road to tourist highway with National Parks along the way, Nerriga is the community between Jervis Bay and the inland. The Wandandian people -Wandi Wandi- were part of the Yuin Nation and travelled up and down from the coast to the higher lands with the seasons. Within 15 years of the arrival of the English to Australia, the Nerriga region was being explored and surveyed. Now travellers find Main Road 92 the easiest route to the inland and that has impacted on the quiet village of Nerriga. Nerriga was part of the gold rush and timber industries with pioneers settling here and now it is part of the tourist route to and from the coast with new adventurers settling here.



Pam saw that this would happen and wrote in her Forward that she hoped 'another writer would present a more detailed account' of Nerriga's history in the future. Nerriga Craft and Museum Centre will present the next edition at the Book Launch at 11 am on Easter Saturday 16<sup>th</sup> April 2022. Markets and other events will also make the day a memorable occasion.

Windellama Landcare has been forced to delay the commencement of its 2022 program. The sites that we proposed to visit in March and April have proven to have poor access because of the recent heavy and continuous rain.

Do you want to see what Landcare does? We assist in a range of activities to support landholders and we have also done some work on public land for example at Budjong Creek Chain of Ponds.



Our initial activity for 2022 now starts on **Saturday 21 May** by looking at two examples of previous work, at this stage the previous projects are, commencing at 9:30 am;

- “Twistwood”, Oallen Ford Road – erosion control and tree planting followed by;
- “The Paddock”, Cullulla Road – erosion control - followed by lunch; and then
- an examination of current erosion on Englisch’s property on Sandy Point Road to assess possible control measures

Our activities are catered with morning tea at 9:30 and lunch.

Further follow up activities proposed in 2022 (with dates to be advised) include:

- Visit to Budjong Creek assessing issues upstream from Chain of Ponds and develop corrective proposals for funding assistance applications
- Plant identification.

## Windellama SES First Aid & CFR

We, at long last, have gone back to face to face training which has simplified things. Our first night was spent with a wish list consisting of things to do and items required.

The Tarago show was our first activity for the year and they were fortunate enough to have a reasonably fine day and the Show was a credit to them.

We had a creek to travel along to get there, the creek happened to be Lumley Road.

I cannot understand why people still try and cross flooded streams which have clearly marked depth gauges, some of which had ½ a metre indicated and you could see tracks of vehicles which had made the crossing and I do not mean trucks. I recall, back in 1974 a car driven by Phillip Irwin was washed 150 metres down Yarralaw Creek on Muffets’ Road, he luckily survived.

SES water technicians from Goulburn have been called to a few incidents out this way recently.

A couple of our members have spent many days away in the Lismore area. They helped in both the Response and Recovery period.

Join our SES unit and this will become clearer to you. Speaking of which, we had a new member join us on our first night back and she was amazed to see the diverse activities in which our portfolio covers. The lady in question has a fair knowledge of human resources.

I hope that you all have a few Rapid Antigen Test kits on hand and use them if necessary. There are more cases becoming apparent in our area.

What a wonderful idea it is to have a Women’s Shed in Tarago, all the best ladies.

Speaking of which, Congratulations must go to Bev McGaw, for her contribution to the Community by the way of communications for the RFS. Well done Bev.

Rainfall at our place was close to the averages of 70mm when we received 56mm. The lowest February rainfall since 2016 when we received 14mm.

## **March 2022 Rainfall**

So far, March has definitely made up for the rain not received in February with 129.5mm received so far. Once again the rain received throughout the district is different with one report quoting 500mm for the year. We have received 338.5mm, a big difference!

## **Weeds**

The thistles that I sprayed have turned their toes up, and are all brown. It's easy to spot those I missed as they are still green but not for long. I live in hope that the sprayed ones seed crop are sterile?

The Fleabane slashed has prevented seed drop and at the same time encouraged new grass shoots that the cattle are munching on and getting fatter.

## **Fruit Trees**

I have started to prune the tops and centres out of all the fruit trees that have finished fruiting. This will help the peaches and nectarines produce new wood for next years crop. All fruit trees this year are going to be pruned harshly with centres removed completely and height greatly reduced.

Cherry/Pear slug are voracious this year with devouring tree leaves overnight. However, Yates Success Ultra works for me and stops them in their tracks.

The Crimson Grapes cropped really well but unfortunately are sour, probably due to lack of sunshine and heat?

## **Vegetable Garden**

Since the last time I wrote we have planted 2 lots of mixed Brassicas. One lot at the end of last month and another today. I find if you can judge rain on planting they do better but regardless, I still dig a planting hole and fill with water. Depending on how quickly the water drains depends on the number of times I fill. I then add a little fertiliser, mainly something like Dynamic Lifter, cover with compost and plant the seedling.

As mentioned previously, I don't turn over the garden bed and just dig planting holes. When adding compost, mulch, fertiliser I just let it lay on top. Green manure crops are whipper snipped and let lay where they fall.

We are finally at last picking some tomatoes

## **Flower Gardens**

After a slow start the petunias have decided to flower, the roses have new growth and some have reached for the sky while others have hardly moved.

## **Bird Life**

Several different types of ducks have visited our dam including Teal, Blacks and Red Ducks.

The eagle has been circling above us by it's self, where normally there is two of them. I hope it's feeding on rabbits

## **Word meanings**

I must be strange because or maybe not, as I do not like the new interpretation of the word **moderate increase** when applied to bills. In our case it meant **over a 100 percent!**

**Windellama rural fire brigade is always ready to assist.** Four Windellama brigade members traveled to Lismore surrounds for a week of flood recovery operations in a joint strike team from the RFS with 20 team members from across southern NSW. Windellama members were appointed as crew leaders for 3 of the 5 units. Well done, Tom, Kym, Scott and Brendan.

During the severe weather across March the brigade was busy undertaking daily patrols of the Windellama area and providing updates on local flooding via our facebook page. We also responded to several vehicle crashes providing initial first aid and making the scene safe before other emergency services such as police and ambulance arrived.

**Bushfire Danger Season Ended 31 March 2021.** Now that we are out of the bushfire danger period, if you are thinking of burning cleared vegetation that you have in a pile there are some rules that you must follow to make it safer for you and your neighbours:

- You must notify all adjoining neighbours and the RFS Fire Control Centre ((02) 6226 3100) at least 24 hours before lighting up. You can also notify the RFS using the online form [www.rfs.nsw.gov.au/fire-information/BFDP/burn-notifications](http://www.rfs.nsw.gov.au/fire-information/BFDP/burn-notifications)
- You must be present to supervise the burn at all times after lighting and ensure it is definitely out before leaving it unattended.
- Piles should not be greater than 2m length or width 1.5 m in height and cleared to 4.5m
- Before lighting consider the weather. Only light the pile if conditions are calm.

All planned burns are registered on a database which means the RFS and other emergency services won't be unnecessarily called out to a smoke sighting which is your pile burn.

Broad beans, unlike other beans, prefer a cool climate and are ready to pick late winter or early spring, when vegetables are scarce. Give the soil a good liming and also add some complete fertilizer or compost before planting. They don't like a high nitrogen fertilizer as this promotes leaves at the expense of the flowers. Mine are usually ready to pick in October.

Other vegetables to plant are peas, cabbage and onions. Greenfeast Peas should be sown in two rows close to each other for support and if you have a fence or wall which gets plenty of winter sunshine, grow Telephone Climbing Peas, they produce a big crop and are worthwhile growing. They prefer a soil which has had a light dressing of lime and complete fertilizer.

FLOWERS; Seedling available now are: Alyssum, Canterbury bells, carnations, cornflower, delphinium, dianthus hollyhock, russel lupins, pansy viola, primula, snapdragon, stocks and wallflower.

Sweet peas can now be sown. Prepare the soil as for the vegetables peas, they grow well in hanging basket or pots.

With autumn now is the time to observe the deciduous trees growing in our area, they should all be in their full colour.

Autumn Colour in small spaces; Want autumn colour but don't have room for a deciduous tree? There's a wealth of beautiful deciduous shrubs that will produce a striking autumn display, especially in cool climates.

BURNING BUSH (*Euonymus alatus*), gets its common name from the brilliant red of its autumn leaves. It can reach height of 3m, or if you prefer something smaller, look for the "Compactus" cultivar, which grows to about 2m tall. Trim back in early spring for an even more compact form.



NINEBARK (*Physocarpus opulifolius*) is an arching shrub that grows to 3m tall and makes a dramatic background plant in autumn, Gold, orange, and red-leafed cultivars are available. In spring it features cluster of small white or pink flowers.

DWARF CREPE MYRTLE (*lagerstroemia indica* 'Nana') provides good autumn colour and attractive summer flowers, and grows in a wide range of climates, from cool temperate to subtropical. Reaching 1.5m tall, it can easily be pruned to shape, which also makes it a great pot plant.



WEEPING JAPANESE MAPLE (*Acer palmatum* Dissectum Group) has a finely cut, lacy foliage that colours beautifully in autumn. The branches weep from an upright stem (this is called a standard), and the mini tree quickly forms an attractive mounded form. It's best placed in morning sun, with some protection from the hottest part of the day, and it makes a good container specimen. There are dozens of other named cultivars to check out too.

### **AGRICULTURE & ENVIRONMENT Report by Robyn Briggs - Ag. & Environment Officer Australia's Household Waste Problem (part 1)**

For a long time Australia was considered amongst the world's best when it came to efficiently dealing with waste. When the 'Keep Australia Beautiful' campaign began it highlighted the problem of waste and Australians enthusiastically joined. But more recently, rising consumer demand for packaged supermarket merchandise, cheap single-use or disposable goods and negative commentary about waste and recycling campaigns has seen a large increase in the amount of product and packaging which is not productively reused or recycled.

According to the Australian Bureau of Statistics, Australia generated 75.8 million tonnes of solid waste in 2018-19, which was a 10% increase over the previous two years. Half of all the waste was sent for recycling, while 27% was sent to landfill for disposal. What happened to the missing 23% is not revealed.

Households alone generated over 12.4 million tonnes (or 16%) of waste. Of this:

- 55% was food waste
- 70% comes from garden waste
- Plastic waste was 47% of the 12.4 million tonnes
- Textile waste accumulated 247,000 tonnes

As a sector that is a substantial contributor to the problem, households could have a significant impact on reducing waste if we adopted a few changes in our behaviour, such as following the 5Rs.....

Refuse and Reduce, Reuse and Repurpose, Recycle.

### **INTERNATIONAL Report by Anne McVilly - International Officer**

The current social and political climate of Malaysia is derived from some news feeds. It has some similarities with ours in the reports of a drowning, a vehicle crash, a court case and political meetings.

Their adult COVID vaccination rate is 65% and the country is opening its borders on 1st April. In the Malaysian capital, Kuala Lumpur, a bank is offering a Commercial Vehicle Financing Scheme as assistance towards economic recovery from the effects of the pandemic. It is most likely to be for smaller vehicles such as taxis and touring buses than to be for the huge trucks that we have in Australia.

A carbon capture scheme was to be started in the state of Sabah but has been cancelled because of a lack of transparency and similar problems.

The Malayan Tiger which is culturally regarded as a very important symbolic animal is now almost extinct with only 150 of them left in the wild.

There is a locally made film being produced that is focussing on the culture brought by the migrating Han dynasty Chinese people, with the aim of bringing together the three major and different cultures of the Malaysian people.

And they are currently having a lot of flooding during the changeover season which is usually dry. Because Malaysia is situated on the equator they get the southern hemisphere monsoons in the same season that we have them in Darwin. In what is our winter Malaysia will then have the northern hemisphere monsoons followed by another changeover.

It was part of the gaol wall and still had the holes where the bars were inserted in the window aperture. There are many other items of interest, all collected over time, which add considerably to the garden's appeal.

The wet Spring and Summer and mild growing conditions have ensured that Doug's garden had put on luxurious growth and was looking fantastic, as all of the plants had responded to the terrific growing conditions. Doug did comment, however, on the amount of extra pruning, trimming and weeding that he had to do, but still the effort was clearly worth the result.

We managed to finish our garden walk just as the next shower of rain came over, although a couple of slower members got trapped in Doug's shed for a while until the rain passed. We promised to save them some morning tea.

Some of our members also recently attended the Argyle Garden Club meeting in Goulburn, where a guest speaker give a presentation on

Australian native orchids. There were some amazing photographs of local orchids, some of which are rare and endangered, and all of them with beautiful flowers. Many of these orchids grow quietly in the ground and we only become aware of them when they flower. The application of fertilizers to paddocks can have a severe effect on their survival, but many survive in more wooded areas and bush blocks. It's a good idea to keep an eye out for them when they flower and mark their areas, especially if they are on the rare and/or endangered list.

Our thanks to the Argyle Garden Club for their invitation to this event.

Around our own gardens, we are still battling weeds, particularly Sifton bush and flea bane, as the mild conditions and wet weather provide excellent conditions for weed growth. Many fruit trees are showing signs of waterlogging, with the fruit splitting, but other crops like corn and tomatoes are flourishing.





Kevin and Margaret's fig tree is loaded with fruit but still not ripe yet, and Peter and Maria report lots of pears, apples and peaches, with the corellas having a great feast of apples.

John and Carolyn have harvested loads of tomatoes this season and have acquired a new bull. Evidently the former bull's performance wasn't quite up to scratch, so he was relocated to the freezer. The new bull clearly understands what is required and the consequences of failure, and is evidently putting in a sterling effort to date.



Rob and Robyn have had a few problems with new trees drying out in some locations, even after all of the rain we have had. Lots of leaf drop was also experienced by some of their maples; other trees nearby are fine. Of course, with all of the previous rain, there was massive leaf growth, so when the soil dried out even a little, the trees appear to have dropped their leaves as a response.

**Warning: this is the season when mushrooms can appear in your lawn. Unless you know exactly what you are doing, do not pick mushrooms. The one pictured came up in our lawn. It is a Destroying Angel, a relative of the Death Cap (*Amanita phylloides*). They have pure white caps, including the gills which are free and not attached to the thin stalk. If scratched they will discolour yellow. They are very poisonous.**
