

## Windellama Rural Fire Brigade

The COVID restrictions have meant that we have had to again postpone our AGM elections but **Windellama Rural Fire Brigade remains open** during any COVID restrictions as an essential emergency service for our community.

With winter frosts causing grassland fuels to cure, we are already seeing **grass fires** take hold and threaten homes and other assets across the region.

Now is a good time to work on **preparing your home** for the fire season, which is only two months away, when you have time instead of waiting until the fire is on your doorstep. The more you prepare your home, the more likely it will survive a bush fire or ember attack. A well prepared home is easier and safer to defend and will offer more protection if you cannot leave. It is important to have a cleared and maintained line of at least 20 metres around your assets.

**Thinking of burning?** There are some rules that you must follow to make it safer for you and your neighbours if you are thinking of burning cleared vegetation:

- You must notify the RFS using the online form [www.rfs.nsw.gov.au/fire-information/BFDP/bern-notifications](http://www.rfs.nsw.gov.au/fire-information/BFDP/bern-notifications) or phone the RFS fire control centre (02) 6226 3100
- You must notify all adjoining neighbours and at least 24 hours before lighting up.
- You must supervise the burn at all times after lighting and ensure it is definitely out before leaving it unattended.
- Piles should not be greater than 2m length or width 1.5 m height and cleared to 4.5 m
- Before lighting consider the weather for the day of your planned burn and also several days afterwards and only light the pile if conditions are calm.

All planned burns are registered on a database which means the RFS and other emergency services won't be unnecessarily called out to a smoke sighting which is your pile burn.

## **June Rainfall**

At our place we received an additional of 17.5mm making rainfall for June 74mm.

## **July Rainfall**

Up to the 18<sup>th</sup> of this month we have received 16.5mm of moisture in the rain gauge. This moisture has been made up of some rain, heavy dews and frosts.

The two heaviest frost were recorded on the 6 and 7<sup>th</sup> of this month.

The last bit of rain at our place recorded was not a true indication of measurement as the wind was blowing so strong, the rainfall was horizontal to the ground.

The frost received this year have played havoc with the older plastic irrigation fittings by opening up the seams and shattering some fittings like tap handles on the gate valves. Also, the end joiner fittings on our pump out system.

Last year the frosts split the metal hose attachments on the taps and also the pump housing on the dam.

## **Weeds**

I noticed a paddock that was covered in flea-ban has been slashed. The grass in this paddock is growing but the big question will be, what will the next crop of flea-ban be like. However, if you don't try something like slashing, you will not know if it will work – hope it does!

## **Fruit Trees**

All of our fruit trees have been sprayed once and soon they will receive a second spray. All the fruit trees are budding up well so will have to get the second spray completed before blossoms appear.

I haven't pruned the grape vines yet but will do soon.

## **Vegetable Garden**

Nothing much happening in this garden except for some cabbages that grew on existing stems from last years growth. One stem had two heads.

## **Flower Gardens**

The flower gardens are a bit drab with only the greenery from the bulbs and self seeded seedlings.

The roses are looking a bit bare with no leaves after the strong winds received recently. Just means less rubbish to get rid off when I prune.

## **Bird Life**

The chooks are starting to lay with one or two eggs every second day.

The Blue Wren male has coloured up and they are carrying nesting material. As long as they keep cleaning up insects they are welcome.

## **End of an era**

The closure of Fife's Produce in Knox street Goulburn sees the end of an era. I always found that anything special I wanted they would do their bet to source. After trying many brands of chook pellets with my hens, I finally got one from this produce store they use to eat and not leave for the Crimson Parrots.

Our garden Club will miss their ongoing support at our various functions and for this ongoing support we thank them.

I believe retirement is their next adventure and on behalf of our club, I wish them well.

This is the month to prepare your vegetables gardens for Spring, add compost, clean animal manure, handful of complete fertilizer and lime per metre.

## VEGETABLES TO SOW;

Seeds;- carrots, parsnip, lettuce, asparagus crowns, rhubarbs crowns, silver beet, onions, peas.

Plants;- Cabbage, lettuce, silver beet, onions ,both brown and white.

## FLOWERS

Seed;- petunias, phlox, sweet peas.

Seedling Pansy, viola, stocks, snapdragons, aquilegia, carnations, dianthus, primula, dwarf sweet William, alyssum, poppies, larkspur.

In our climate roses and fruit trees can still be pruned. After pruning spray roses with rose spray. Fruit trees with white oil for mites and scales, or Lime Sulphur (for leaf curl). If this season is wet, it is recommended to spray the fruit trees with Benlate which is a Systemic Fungicide.

Things to do now;-

Apply a slow-release fertilizer to pot plants in preparation for spring.

Sprinkle wood ash and fertilizer around bearded iris to promote a good show in late spring.

Check compost to see if it`s wet and gluggy, if so add dry material such as straw, leaves or shredded paper. And mix in.

Prune winter-blooming varieties of natives, such as banksia, correas and grevilleas, to tidy them up and promote new growth in spring.

Dig out broadleaf weeds such as dandelions, out of the lawn.

Lift and divide established clumps of delphiniums, and replant them in freshly prepared soil.

Gather dusty indoor plants and put them in the shower for a good wash.

Trim and tidy maidenhair and Boston ferns, repot if required, and remember to check for pest such as mealy bugs.

Plant late winter-blooming shrubs, such as ericas, japonica camellias and magnolias.



gave us a demonstration of how to prune your trees to get fruit of a manageable height to harvest and to increase fruit production. The ABC's "Gardening Australia" website has a fact sheet on pruning fruit trees, so if you want more information you might like to check it out.

Speaking of pruning, Danny and Vivien have been busy pruning their 2000 plus grape vines, ready for spring growth. They have their wicking beds in place and still have lots of carrots, silverbeet and other brassicas to harvest. If you are interested in making your own wicking beds look at the "Small Farms Network Capital Region" website where they have recently conducted an excellent webinar about the best methods of construction. The video of the webinar will be uploaded shortly into the Resources page.

Sue is battling rats, which are digging up the ground around her fruit trees, but her daffodils and jonquils are out, providing a great show.

Lynda has been busy planting some Lucerne mix to improve the nitrogen in her soil, ready for spring growth, whilst Judy and Warren's mandarin tree is loaded with fruit this year.

Doug has taken the opportunity to prune his extensive hedges and other shrubs, and has cleverly waited until the relatives visit, so they could help.

Our next meeting will be at Owen and Ann's lovely property in Mount Fairy, and we are all looking forward to seeing them there, COVID restrictions permitting.

# Jerrara Power

The Scoping Report for the Jerrara Power energy from waste facility was lodged with the Department of Planning, Industry and Environment (DPIE) on 22 June 2021.

The Scoping Report identifies the possible environmental, economic and social impacts of our proposal and the investigations we propose to undertake to understand, manage and mitigate any impacts during construction and operation.

DPIE sought feedback on the Scoping Report from various government agencies in order to prepare the Secretary's Environmental Assessment Requirements (SEARs).

It followed a site visit and Planning Focus Meeting held with agency representatives on 9 June 2021.

The SEARs tell us what we need to do to progress our proposal so we can lodge an Environmental Impact Statement (EIS).

The SEARs were due to be received by the end of July 2021.

A draft **Terms of Reference** has been prepared and is available to view on Jerrara Power's website. The Terms of Reference will be finalised in consultation with members at the first CRG meeting. It is anticipated the CRG will meet once per month at a day and time to be agreed with members.

### We are seeking members, of all ages, who:

- are interested in contributing to the design and environmental assessment of the Jerrara Power energy from waste facility to get the best outcome for the community
- can help to represent a broad range of views that reflect the diversity of the community
- are willing to contribute constructively to CRG meetings.

### Community representatives should meet one of more of the following criteria:

- involvement in the wider community and strong community networks and linkages
- good knowledge and understanding of the local issues which are relevant to the proposal
