#### WINDELLAMA PROGRESS ASSOCIATION PRESIDENTS REPORT 2022-23

Again, the Association has achieved various goals, and I'm sure will continue to do so.

The reporting year kicked off with the Cake Auction. This was a huge success with the money raised more than double any previous amount. All proceeds going to the Can Assist Cancer Foundation in Goulburn.

An increase in hall hire fees has not distracted visiting motor -home groups using the hall for stays. It is also pleasing to see that more and more locals are utilizing the hall for family events, and why not? After all, it is **a community** hall.

The Car Boot Sale, in conjunction with the markets, is now a regular occurrence with local organizations benefitting from *II* Gold Coin *II* donation proceeds.

The Primary School Presentation Day was returned to the hall and a great afternoon was had by all with both our State MP and Mayor in attendance. A total of 5 grants of 250 each was provided by Progress with another 3 grants provided by the Windellama News.

A grant of \$500 to the Bungonia Park Trust for upkeep of the War Memorial was provided and a closer association with the Bungonia and Windellama Progress Associations is now in place with both Presidents in regular touch regarding mutual community concerns.

During the pre-Xmas period another first for the Association was the "Giving Tree" in the hall. This was the Secretary's idea and was a huge success with a multitude of presents being donated to Mission Australia for less fortunate families, especially the children, to have an enriched Xmas.

The interaction of Goulburn/ Mulwaree Council, including Councilors <u>and</u> Executive Staff and Progress is also now regularly established. This interaction has resulted not only in improved roadworks being monitored but more community input into future Infrastructure planning.

WINDELLAMA boundary signs now exist on all main approaches to the community and this adequately typifies the preceding paragraph.

The ongoing ties between the life-saving Windellama RFS continue to strengthen. The ability and **want** of both organizations to serve the community together binds them in a common purpose, well recognized within the community. Given the revitalized interaction with the School and its P and C organization, the Historical Society and the various district charity groups, it can easily be seen that Progress has moved from a "hall only' organization to a focal entity of the community.

I would particularly like to single out the kitchen volunteers and the market coordinators for their diligence and hard work they put into the monthly markets. Whilst the profits from this activity continue to grow, *it* is the coming together of the community *in* friendship and harmony which is thanks to *their* efforts, that I find most pleasing.

2023-24 will again be full of challenges for the community, but I am sure with the quality of the members of the Committee **and** the Windellama News staff, that no problems will *arise* that cannot be overcome by the Windellama Progress Association.

I thank you one and all for your support and particularly your friendship

during the reporting period and look forward to your companionship in 2023-24.

NSW RURAL FIRE SERVICE

#### Windellama Rural Fire Brigade

With winter frosts causing grassland fuels to cure, we saw during July many grass fires take hold and threaten homes and other assets across the region.

Thinking of burning? There are some rules that you must follow to make it safer for you and your neighbours if you are thinking of burning cleared vegetation:

- You must notify the RFS online form <u>www.rfs.nsw.gov.au/fire-information/BFDP/burn-notifications</u> or phone the RFS fire control centre (02) 6226 3100. This is an online notification and not a permit. Permits are used during the bushfire danger period, are not often issued and require a property visit and assessment.
- You must notify all adjoining neighbours and at least 24 hours before lighting up.
- You must supervise the burn at all times after lighting and ensure it is completely out.
- · Piles should not be greater than 2m length or width 1.5 m height and cleared to 4.5 m
- Before lighting consider the weather for the day and also several days afterwards.

#### **Brigade activity**

- 2 units from Windellama, 2 Tarago and 2 from Gundary responded to a car fire and escaped pile burn at Tarago
- · 5 units from Windellama and 2 from Bungonia grassfire on Oallen Ford Rd
- · 6 firefighters and 1 unit to a bushfire on Muffets Rd
- 4 Windellama units, 2 Nerriga, 2 Tarago, 2 Bungonia, 2 Gundary, 1 Taylors Ck, 1 Charleyong, Sthn Tablelands Group Captain and a D5 Dozer bushfire Mogo Rd.
- · 4 Windellama units responded to a good intent (false alarm) call to Mogo Rd
- 1 unit to MVA Oallen Ford Rd providing assistance prior to ambulance and police arrival
- 3 Windellama units, 2 Bungonia, 2 Tarago, 1 Taylor's Ck, 1 Currawang, 1 Braidwood Fire and Rescue and ambulance and police to a house fire

#### June 2023 Rainfall at our place

For June, we had an additional capture of moisture in the rain gauge of 20.5mm, for a total of 35.5mm for this month at our place.

Last year at the end of June, total rainfall was 584.50mm. This year total rainfall to end of June is 334.5mm.

#### July 2023 Rainfall at our place

Moisture collected in the rain gauge up to the 18<sup>th</sup> of July has been made up of the weather elements Dew, Mist, Frost and a few drops of Rain. Collected so far is 10mm of moisture in the rain gauge.

#### Windellama Road Gardening

When driving along Windellama Road you will notice quite a few homes have tall Leylandi Conifers partially surrounding their homes. The main colour used is a pure green version. In some cases, people have grown the golden frill version. These trees can grow quite quickly and tall in a climates and soil conditions that exists along our road.

The trees that are growing at our place, were planted like other properties in hedge form on the East, South and Western sides, leaving the Northern side open. This situation creates a micro climate good for gardening, except, when we have any wind from a Northerly direction.

So, the benefits of these trees at our place because they are grown very close together, create a wind break and provide shade plus, they also diffuse noise from the road to a certain extent, and once again this depends on the direction of the wind. I suppose they were also grown for privacy? The birds like to nest in them, especially the crested pigeons and the residential magpie when the weather was rough.

I have noticed with these conifers that the ones grown in water alleys do not like wet feet because they go brown, and after a period of time, can turn their toes up!

#### Soil Conditioners

Another good soil conditioner and one I like, is mulch made from various types of Hay or Sugar Cane. To these mulches I add Blood and Bone and Chicken Manure Pellets.

Lately, I have been writing about soil conditioners and my use of them is because the soil for gardening at our place and I expect most other properties is crap for vegetables, flowers and fruit trees and vines.

Even though I have been adding soil conditioners, I find the garden beds still gobble this addition up.

I do not dig over my garden beds any more but just add some type of soil conditioner each year.

#### Jobs for the month at our place

Next month will be time to prune your roses and depending on growth made, is how much you remove. As a general rule if growth made is vigorous, I remove two thirds plus any old wood or diseased wood. If the plant has not made to much growth I give it a tidy up but I always try to prune so the bush looks like an upside umbrella, that is nothing left in the centre of the bush.

When pruning I always use sharp tools and disinfect tools between bushes. For a disinfectant I use a rag soaked in Mentholated Spirits. After pruning I spray the plants with Lime Sulphur.

I have been waiting for the fruit trees to drop their final few leaves but this year they seem to be hanging onto them so that I can do a final prune e.g. branches growing down, broken bits and the new growth reaching for the clouds.

Now is the time to add a grease band to the trunk of fruit trees to help stop and catch different pest moving from the soil to tree canopy, especially Codlin Moth Lava.

It's also time to prune your grape vines.

#### **Bird Life**

The Magpies at our place have started their territory disputes already and the males are quite vocal and savage as they sought each other out.

The smaller birds like the yellow Robins are also guite active.

I noticed that the Bower Birds, Magpies and Crested Pigeons are enjoying a feed of chook pellets each day. I don't mind this happening because my fussy chooks don't eat them.

#### Windellama SES First Aid & CFR

We for a change have had a few quiet weeks as far as SES and CFR callouts have been concerned. This is relief for our crews.

This may be the time to remind people as to the situation involving trees that have fallen on Local Council roads and who is responsible for the removal of these trees. Removal of the trees is the responsibility of the Local Council.

We, on the other hand are responsible for the removal trees blocking access to a private property and trees that impact on buildings. This comes under our Floods Storm and Tsunami Policy.

We do remove trees from Local Roads after first consulting with the Council. Local Government can easily be severely impacted in other areas and need help from other agencies.

We welcomed two new members to our Unit just recently.

#### What's happening with the Incinerator?

It may have seemed quiet recently, but the fight is definitely not over! Veolia are currently preparing their response to the resounding 619 formal objections lodged during the public exhibition last year. Despite 98.8% of all submissions being objections, Veolia is forging ahead with their plans to burn Sydney's waste at Woodlawn. We can expect another lengthy document to review once Veolia's contractors finish their attempt to answer the thousands of issues raised in regard to the incinerator's Environmental Impact Statement (EIS).

#### What happens once Veolia submits their response to the NSW Department of Planning?

The Department will upload Veolia's response to the Planning Portal for everyone to review. They'll examine Veolia's response and seek more information from Veolia if they feel the response is insufficient, or they'll make a recommendation about whether or not they assess the proposal should proceed. #### Can the community respond to new information in Veolia's submission?

YES! Once Veolia's 'response to submissions' is available, we all have the opportunity to review the document and contact the Department of Planning to alert them to any issues of concern. It will be important to read Veolia's response and make sure the concerns you raised have been adequately addressed. We'll have more information about this on our website and FB pages once Veolia's response is available – www.NoTaragoIncinerator.com.

#### What happens after the Department makes its recommendation?

The decision about whether or not the incinerator can proceed will be made by the NSW Independent Planning Commission. This is because there were so many objections, and because our local Councils also submitted objections. The community will also have a chance to make their voices known during this process, and we'll provide more details at that time.

### Why does Veolia get so long to respond to submissions when the community were only given 6 weeks to read the 3,000 page technical EIS?

Good question. Why should a company that's asking us to trust them with the complex operation of an industrial incinerator need 6 months to fix the information in a document it took 2 years preparing? Obviously the community concerns raised in our objections are proving very hard to answer.

#### Does the new government have a new incineration policy?

No. The new Labor Party administration continues to support building waste incinerators in four locations across the state. Tarago is the furthest advanced in the planning process.

Keep following us on Facebook and our website for updates as the process continues. And be sure to *keep reporting odour, leaking containers and any other issues* from Woodlawn. Each of these reports helps demonstrate why the community cannot trust Veolia's promises about a 'safe' incinerator.



Prepare your gardens ,for spring planting by adding compost, any clean animal manure and lime(handful per metre ).

VEGETABLES TO SOW;-

Seeds;- Carrots, parsnip, lettuce, silver beet, onions, peas.

Also asparagus and rhubarb crowns.

Plants;- Cabbage, lettuce, silver beet onions all types. (Cover with a net to protect from cabbage moth).

FLOWERS;-

Seeds can be sown during August- petunias, phlox.

Seedlings available are pansy, viola, stocks, snapdragon, aquilegia, carnation, dianthus, primula, dwarf sweet Williams, alyssum, poppies, larkspur.

Pruning of roses and fruit trees can still be done this month. Spray apple, pear, plum, quince and your roses with Winter oil, this controls mite and scale. Also spray fruit trees for leaf curl with lime Sulphur spray no later, then the pinking of the buds. Roses can also be sprayed with Lime Sulphur for black spot.

You can Plant winter-blooming Hardenbergia violacea `Happy Wanderer` where it can drape over an old stump, a low wall or sunny bank

Turn your compost to in corporate leaves that were added in autumn.

Give daphne a light prune after blooming has finished.

Allow house plants to dry out between waterings, and keep them away from indoor heat sources.

Weed out oxalis, taking care to check that all the bulbils have been removed from the soil.

You can plant wintersweet (Chimonanthus praecox) in cool climate areas so its fragrance will perfume the winter garden for years to come.

You can divide clumps of perennials such as delphinium, chrysanthemum and achillea, dig in some compost and replant them.

Inspect bottlebrush and melaleuca for the leaf- eating larvae of callistemon sawfly, don gloves and remove the grubs by hand.

Take cutting from roses now. Miniature roses, grow well from cutting.

Well, we all finally had the chance to see Warren and Judy's new home in Goulburn, and what a treat it was. Nestled at the end of a quiet street just outside the centre of Goulburn, Warren and Judy's home was a welcoming retreat from the rainy and cold weather outside. The garden area is coming along nicely and there are great plans for more planting and development come spring and summer. Like most of our gardens, the plants are having a nice rest during the cold of winter and gathering their strength for a burst of growth in the warmer months to come.



Warren had lit a cosy drum fire outside, but the rain kept trying to put it out, so we retreated back inside, except for a few hardy souls who decided to start of game of quoits in the back year. Most of us hadn't played quoits for many a long year and it really showed.

There was little to report concerning our gardens, as the cold winter took its toll on anything that even thought of trying to grow, but we are all looking forward to a burst of activity in spring, as the weather warms, the days get longer and we all come slowly out of our winter hibernation.

Whilst we are waiting for better weather outside, Warren reminded us of the joys of raising indoor plants. He has a fine collection of African violets, which he propagates himself through leaf cuttings. His technique is simple but very effective and has produced a fine array of new



plants. Basically, Warren cuts off a leaf leaving sufficient stem material to be able to split at the base. New plantlets are produced at the base of the stem which develop roots and can then be separated when they have developed sufficiently. The only problem is that you can get too many new plants with not enough space to house them. But they make great gifts! African violets love a brightly lit spot indoors but not direct sun.

Winter is a good time, though, to start all those construction ideas that we have been planning to do



for some time, when we are not busy in the garden planting, weeding, harvesting and trying to keep the birds and other visitors from helping themselves to our hard won produce. Robyn and Rob have finally started to build an entrance gate, with the brickwork just finished. The gate itself will take a little longer, but in the meantime the planning of suitable gardens and shrubs around the entrance has begun. The search is on now for suitable large shrubs that neither kangaroos nor deer like to eat. Hopefully the planting can be completed before summer with the

plants well established, as we are anticipating a hot summer this year to go with the cold winter. Speaking of hot (and maybe dry) summers, we heard from a neighbour recently that oak trees are pretty good in bushfires.
