Windellama News February 2024

November 2023 Rainfall at our place

We received an additional drop of 130.25 for November adding to the early drop of 11.5 gave us a total fall of 141.75mm.

December 2023 rainfall at our place

We received another good fall of 100.5mm for this month and the grass is green and has not stopped growing and the garden has been revived with all the seedlings we had transplanted. The dam has made it up to the spillway, so, that gives an indication of how low our dam was. The year 2023 saw 667.30mm of moisture recorded. Compared to 2022 where we received 1110mm. A difference of 442mm.

January 2024 Rainfall at our place

Up to 9am Thursday 18th January this year we have received 84.5mm of rain.

In our garden

At the end of October/September I was thinking we are in for a hot and dry time and was preparing the garden for such an event, when the rain came and did it come!

The dam is full, as are the tanks, the grass is green and lush, the garden is alive with the majority of plants thriving.

When conditions are right, as they are now, plants seem to grow very quickly. Cucumbers transplanted at end of November are fruiting and being picked, tomatoes are reaching for the sky and flowering. A couple of different small pumpkins I'm trying have taken off and are with fruit.

The Dahlias have shot up very quickly, that is, the ones the Rabbits haven't got too. Some of the roses have done extremely well, especially White Sale and My Hero, a pink rose. The blooms on

this pink rose are saucer size and the bush is covered with blooms.

Just as most things we like thrive, so do some things we don't, like weeds the gardener's bane. Conditions are ripe for fungal problems like Black spot in Roses, Brown Rot on fruit and Powdery Mildew on our vine plants like pumpkins and grapes.

For fungal problems like black spot on roses, instead of spraying I feed with a fertiliser and I find this works for me.

As soon as the Apricots get Brown Rot I spray with an organic spray made from Baking Soda – heaped teaspoon, Vegetable Oil a teaspoon and a little soap – couple of drops and 4 litres of water. Mix well together and saturate tree, bush or plant. I also remove diseased/fungal effected fruit and bag in a plastic bag before disposal.

Vine plants like pumpkins I spray with an organic spray containing 1 part full cream milk and 10 parts water. Shake well and drench vine.

Fruit Trees

The Cherry Trees have leaves growing back but unfortunately, no fruit this year. The early Apricots that are normally ripe at Christmas have at least a week to go. The early peaches that are normally ripe for eating at Christmas still have weeks to go, if they ever will mature. The red grapes are loaded. Apple trees are loaded. The plums were loaded with blossom but did not go onto the next stage and fruit. Pears are baron as are the plum-cote trees after both trees were in full bloom with flowers.

Jobs for the month at our place

Keep alert for fungal problems and get the Weed Wand out of semi-retirement.

The Magpie numbers have increased and are fattening-up on the multitude of bugs.



Windellama SES First Aid & CFR

May I wish one and all, the very best for the New Year on behalf of our SES and CFR team.

We had 107 jobs for the past 12 months, 15 of which related to Storm and Water damage, the remaining calls, 92 in all, were for the Community First Responder side of things. This equates to 2 calls for assistance per week on paper.

We in fact may have 3 calls in one 24 hour period and then, maybe, a week will go by without a call, so averages are deceiving. The result of this being that we have some very tired responders.

This brings me to the same old evergreen, when are some of the good citizens of this area going to join our SES/ CFR? I have had people promise to join, but, never appear, this, I must say, is very disappointing .

Fortunately we have two previous members coming back and three new members joining our organization.

Just to remind people, we meet for SES on the second and third Monday of each month at 1830 hours and for CFR (Ambulance) training on the fourth Saturday of each month at 0830 hrs, so do not be shy and come along, just tell them that Kev sent you. The undergrowth along the sides of our minor roads, in particular, is creating an unsafe visibility situation, so please take care. They would be highly unsafe in fire exit situation.

Windellama Landcare is back in operation for 2024.

Windellama Landcare held its AGM in December 2023 and reported on a very successful recent completion of a project funded under the NSW Landcare Riparian Restoration Program and the repair some of the 2022-23 waterway damage. Landcare undertakes or assists similar work on both private and public property.



The recently completed projects involved controlling and repairing creek bank erosion on two sites. The first is on a tributary of Budjong Creek running parallel with Sandy Point Rd. The second site is a problem area of Budjong Creek near Miller Rd.

The project involved installation of coir logs at sites where the creek bank was collapsing into the watercourse and stabilisation of bare areas of creek bed to reduce the erosive effects of rainfall. To help stabilise areas adjacent to the eroded banks and reduce the water table some 800 trees and shrubs as tube stock have been planted. Only those eucalypts shown to be tolerant of future expected climate conditions were planted.

This was an important project to save our local watercourses and land. If you are interested in erosion control being undertaken on your property or would like to be involved in Landcare, please contact John Pearce (0435 586 281) or Tony Greville on (0418 412 460).

Grass Fire Risk

As we continue into the last month of summer, it's important for members of the Windellama community to be aware of the dangers of grass fires. These types of fires can spread quickly and are often caused by human activity such as carelessly discarded cigarettes, or machinery.

During February, grass and other vegetation can quickly become dry and more susceptible to fire. Even a small spark can ignite a raging fire that can quickly spread, endangering lives and properties. That's why it's essential to be prepared and take precautions to prevent grass fires:

- Clear any dry or dead grass and other flammable vegetation around your property.
- Keep a close eye on the weather forecast and be aware of the fire danger rating.
- Never leave campfires or barbecues unattended and make sure they are completely
 extinguished before leaving.
- · Be mindful of any activities that may generate sparks, such as welding or grinding.

It is time to plant your vegetables for the winter garden.

VEGETABLES

Plant cabbages, cauliflower, broccoli, and Brussel sprouts. This enable them to get established, before the cold weather. They need a soil containing plenty of compost and well rotted animal manure, also a light dressing of lime before planting. When these plants start to grow give them a side dressing of nitrogen fertilizer and at regular intervals a liquid fertilizer applied in the cool of the day will assist the plants in growing, as they all do better if grown quickly.

Other vegetables that can be planted are carrots, parsnips, celery, kohlrabi, lettuce, parsley, radish and turnips.

FLOWERS

If your garden is facing north and is sunny, plant seedling of pansies, viola, stocks, poppies, and alyssums. Other flowers to plant are calendula, carnations, polyanthus, larkspur, linaria, snapdragon, static, and verbena.

Choose your bulbs to plant for spring flowering , bulbs can be planted in mass, in group plantings, rockeries or in pots. You can dig up daffodil bulbs and jonquils, and divide and replant or give some away.You can lift tulip and hyacinth bulbs, store them in the refrigerator to replant in April or May.

Prepare garden beds for autumn planting of bulbs, sweet peas and winter and spring annuals by digging in compost and organic fertilizer.

Fruit trees; Watch for fruit fly, so continue spraying apple, pear and quinces tree to control these pests, with Lebaycide.

Also Cherry slug is about, found on cherries, and pears. You can spray with Yates Success or dust with lime.

Another job is rose pruning. You can reduce the height of the new wood and this will ensure a crop of new well developed roses in the autumn. They will benefit also from a light dressing of complete rose fertilizer.

I have had a good crop of red roses this year, picking 3-4 flowers at a time and putting them in a vase, every third day.

LEMON TREES- I have had plenty of questions about growing lemon trees.

First plant them in a raised garden, so they can drain well. Cover the trees from frost and cold winds in the winter. Fertilizer about 3 times a year with Citrus fertilizer; end of winter, then after the fruit has set, and again before the cold sets in. If growing in a pot you may need to fertilizer more, give it a feed with seasol. Cover the roots with mulch, not too close to the trunk. Don't give the plant lime its changes the ph., of the soil.

There were reports of an increase in pests particularly pear and cherry slug and slaters in various sites throughout.

Peter the recalcitrant bull has improved his numbers to keep his place on the property. There was talk that perhaps without constant vigilance he may stop with the performance anxiety currently exhibited.


Doug has put his skills to making anvils out of different gauge railway tracks. Very clever man. Noel is still making more wooden toys for the kids.
