

Spicy Sweet Rabbit

3 young rabbits, saddles and hind legs only
 2 tablespoons oil
 2 rashers bacon, rind removed and chopped
 2 cloves garlic, bruised and chopped finely
 2 tablespoons Italian parsley, chopped finely
 ½ teaspoon dried red chilli peppers or ½ to 1
 teaspoon Sambal Oelek (hot chilli paste)
 1 tablespoon brown sugar
 2 cups dry white wine
 1 tablespoon tomato paste, mixed with 2 table-
 spoons water
 ¼ cup raisins
 ¼ cup blanched almonds (optional)
 1 tablespoon red currant jelly
 salt, to taste
 2 teaspoons cornflour mixed with 2 table-
 spoons water (optional)

Cut saddles through backbone, into 4 cm pieces and sever legs through thigh joints. Heat oil in a large casserole over a high heat. Brown bacon, stir in garlic and parsley and cook 1 minute. Lift out with a slotted spoon and reserve. Brown rabbit pieces on all sides, stirring with a wooden spatula. Return the first cooked ingredients, add chilli, sugar and wine. Cover and simmer, over low heat for 10 minutes. Stir in tomato paste, raisins and almonds. Cover and cook slowly over low heat until rabbits are tender, about 30 minutes. (Depends very much on the age of the rabbits.) Stir in jelly and taste. Add salt if needed. Over a high heat, reduce sauce until it is a syrup consistency or alternatively, thicken sauce with cornflour and water, over a low heat until sauce thickens and clears. Serve with boiled fettuccine or rice.

Note: 2 kg chicken pieces can be substituted for the rabbits.



Greetings everyone. Hope you enjoy the following recipes. The *Spicy Sweet Rabbit* is a favourite at our place; although I normally substitute chicken breast fillet for the rabbit.

Chicken with Chorizo and Green Chilli

4 tbsp olive oil
 4 half chicken fillets, cut into pieces
 3 chorizo sausages, cut into 2cm rounds
 1 onion, roughly chopped
 3 garlic cloves, sliced thinly
 1 red capsicum, deseeded, diced
 2 celery sticks, sliced
 1 leek, trimmed and sliced
 2 bay leaves
 3 thyme leaves
 3 green chillies, deseeded and finely chopped
 1 tsp sweet paprika
 400g can chopped tomatoes
 200ml sherry or white wine
 salt and freshly ground black pepper

Heat the olive oil in a large casserole over medium heat. Add the chicken pieces and chorizo and cook for 10 minutes, turning to colour evenly on all sides. Remove all the meat from the pan and set aside.


In the same pan, add the onion, garlic and red capsicum and cook for 5 minutes. Add the celery, leek, bay leaves and thyme and cook for a further 5 minutes. Add the chilli and paprika and stir to combine. Return the chicken and chorizo to the pan, add the tomatoes and white wine or sherry. Cover and cook for 30 minutes or until the chicken is cooked through. Season to taste. Serve with chopped flat-leaf parsley scattered over top.


